

JUNCTION MAN KILLED WHEN CAR GOES OVER BANK

Sam Allan, Fredericton Junction Instantly Killed Yesterday at 2.30—Ford Car Plunged Over Bank at Junction—Relatives There

Sam Allen, elderly resident of Fredericton Junction was instantly killed when the Ford Car in which he was driving, plunged over an embankment and into the waters of the Oromocto river at approximately 2.30 o'clock yesterday afternoon. According to eye witnesses of the accident, Mr. Allan was driving down the road when he suddenly turned his machine into the yard of Dr. McIntyre on the bank of the river. Unable to stop the car, the deceased was carried over the bank and into the river. When picked up by several persons he was dead.

It is understood that Mr. Allan has been a resident of Fredericton Junction for some time and is survived by brothers and sisters of that place. Deceased was popular with a large circle of friends and his sudden untimely death has cast a gloom over the neighborhood.

The telegram bore merely the words "killed by train". It is understood, however, that Mrs. Kelly was struck by a moving train in the vicinity of one of the large stations in that city and was injured so severely that death ensued immediately. Mrs. Kelly is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Cunningham of this city.

Well Known Here.

Mrs. Kelly and her husband were well known in this city and had a host of friends. It is but several years ago that the couple moved to Montreal to take up their residence Mr. Kelly has been employed with Porter Brothers, contractors for the past year. Previous to this, he was engaged in construction work.
