

HON. MR. BENNETT
WILL BE HERE
ON AUGUST 18

Conservative Leader to
Speak at the Arctic
Rink in the Evening—
Is a Graduate of the
P. N. S.

Mr. R. B. Hanson, K. C., announced this morning that he had received definite word that Hon. R. B. Bennett, M. P., leader of the Conservative party, had decided to include Fredericton in his maritime itinerary and will address a public meeting in this city on the evening of Saturday, Aug. 18th. The Arctic Rink, which can easily provide seating accommodation for three thousand people, has been procured for the occasion and an energetic committee have already started to make the necessary arrangements. Hon. Mr. Bennett spoke at New Glasgow yesterday and will tour Cape Breton and Prince Edward Island before returning to New Brunswick.

No Stranger Here.

Hon. Mr. Bennett will not come to Fredericton as a stranger for it was at the Provincial Normal School here that he qualified for the teaching profession. He afterwards studied law at Dalhousie University and was admitted an attorney in this city in the autumn of 1892, and a barrister the following year. He practised at Chatham in partnership with the late Governor Tweedie, and in 1897 removed to Calgary, where he has since made his home.

The last Federal political chieftain to visit Fredericton was Hon. Arthur Meighen, who while holding the office of Prime Minister came here during a bye-election in 1921 and spoke to a large gathering at the Arctic Rink. Hon. Mr. Bennett has been well received in Nova Scotia by people of all shades of politics and a cordial welcome awaits him in Fredericton.
