

## YOUNG GIRL WAS STRUCK BY CAR AND KILLED

**Bertha Burgoyne 11 Years Old St. Andrews Girl Died From Injuries—Local Traveller in Car.**

Provincial Police headquarters in this city received word of the accidental death of Bertha Burgoyne, 11 year old daughter of Paul Burgoyne farmer of St. Andrews, death coming almost instantly when the young girl was struck by an automobile at Quisibis late yesterday. The automobile was driven by R. M. Dealy, a resident of this city and a commercial traveller. The victim of the accident was crossing the road to get pail of water, when the car struck her fracturing her skull. She died before a doctor could be summoned.

Mrs. Leon Morrison and Mrs. Wilfred Ringuette, St. Andrews women were eye witnesses of the dreadful accident. Immediate attention was given the young girl and Dr. G. A. Cloutier of St. Leonards was summoned, arriving soon after the accident. But the girl had expired before his arrival. Although investigation is being made into the untimely death of the young girl it is deemed to have been accidental and an inquest was not held.

Constable Hale of the Provincial detachment of Edmundston phoned news of the accident to headquarters in this city yesterday and Constable Stokoe was sent over for the purpose of investigation and inquiry. According to the eye witnesses, the accident victim had stepped from out of her father's car into the path of the car owned and driven by the local man.

## DOAKTOWN MAN SENT FOR TRIAL CIRCUIT COURT

**Wilbert MacDuff Arrested in Forgery Charge Elected Trial by Jury—Six Charges Laid.**

Wilbert MacDuff, Doaktown man, who was arrested several days ago by Chief of Police Nathaniel Jones, following an attempt to pass a bogus check at a local grocery store on St. John street, appeared before the Police Magistrate this morning in the local police court, and sufficient evidence was found to commit him for trial. The prisoner elected trial by jury and will be sent up for trial at the September sitting of the Circuit court. Six charges, all from this city were laid against the young man for the same offence that of attempted forgery during the past summer.

The Doaktown man was up for hearing on Wednesday morning but was remanded until this morning without any preliminary hearing. Several attempts last week to pass these bogus checks at local stores led to the arrest of the man. After being unsuccessful in one dry goods store, he
