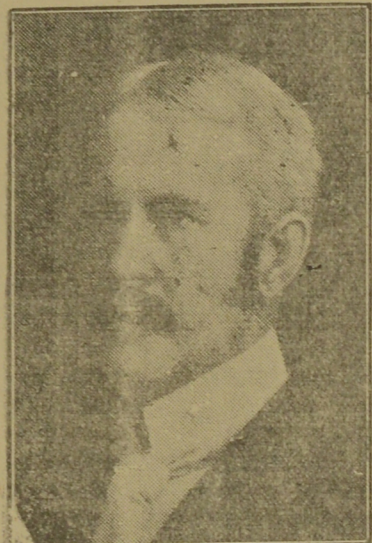


INTERESTING CEREMONY AT U. N. B. TODAY

A Memorial Tablet to the First Graduates Unveiled in the Arts Building With Appropriate Ceremony.

A bronze tablet in commemoration of the granting of the first degrees at the University of New Brunswick one hundred years ago was unveiled in the corridor of the arts building this afternoon with appropriate ceremony. There was a large gathering of spectators, including members of the faculty, and students, members of the senate and alumni and alum-

The first graduates of the university were Samuel Denny, Lee Street, Timothy R. Wetmore and Rev. Daniel Hailes Smith.

The unveiling ceremony was performed by Mr. L. Lee Street, of Boston, a grandson of one of the early graduates.

An address by Dr. C. C. Jones, giving some historical data in connection with the university will be given.

FAMILY QUARREL AIRED IN THE CITY POLICE COURT

Ezra Miller, Arrested at the Instance of His Two Sons on a Charge of Assault.

Mr. Miller objected to her moving the straw as it made dirt on the barn floor and according to the evidence of Ralph Miller was having a strenuous argument with her when he (Ralph) arrived on the scene.

THE HOSPITAL TRUSTEES HELD A MEETING

Dr. Morehouse Precipitates Lengthy Discussion on the Need of More Accommodation For Contagious Diseases.

The May meeting of the trustees of Victoria Public Hospital, was held last evening in the Mayor's office, City Hall, with a big attendance of members and lots of business awaiting consideration.

President Reid was in the chair, and as usual, kept the members alive to the matters under discussion. By invitation, Dr. Morehouse was in attendance and while his field of labor is an extended one, he willingly spent a couple of hours in discussing with the Trustees health matters, especially affecting Fredericton and vicinity. In the present outbreak of contagious diseases in the capital city and vicinity he saw nothing bordering upon an epidemic, but emphasized the importance of providing more extended hospital accommodation for the care of scarlet fever and diph-

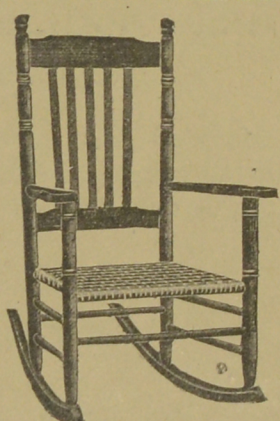

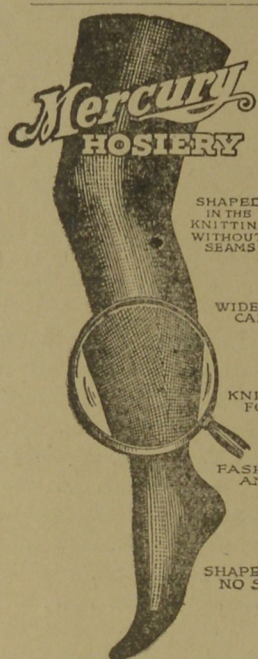
