FLOWERS OR FLIVVERS

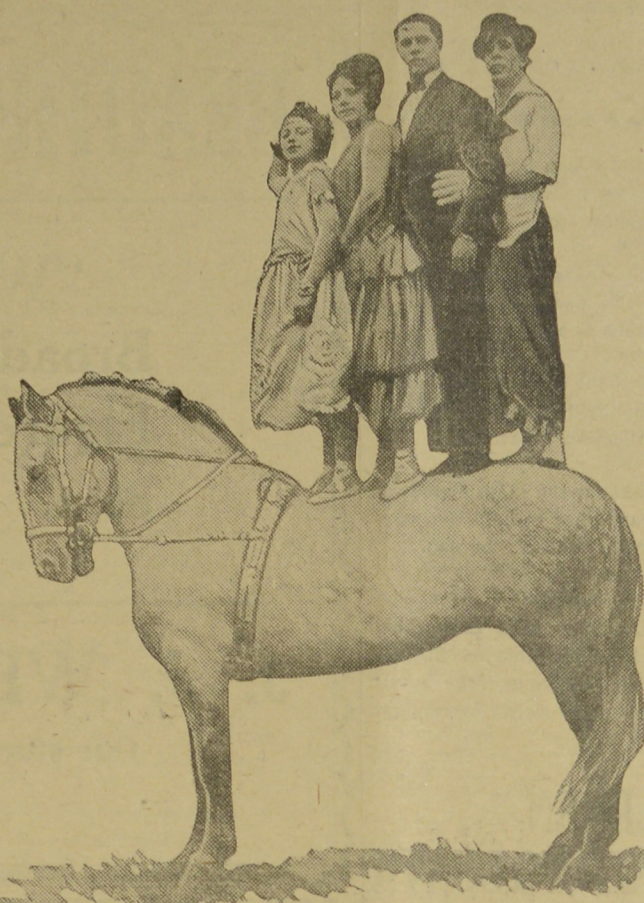
A single flow'r he sent me since we met

IMPERIALS EVEN UP SECOND SECTION BY 7-6 WIN AT DEVON

Imperials Get Early Lead, Lose it, Then Win Game in Final Frame—"Nobby" McLenahan Saves Game by Wonderful Catch on Line Drive to Centre in Final Inning—Home Runs by "Snap" Thompson and E. Miles Feature Hitting—Murray Kierstead Captures Three Bingles.

Devon and Fredericton battled through seven innings of baseball of the slam-bang variety last evening on the Devon Diamond, the Imps getting the verdict by the score of seven to six, thus coming to even terms in the league standing of the second section; with each team having won and lost two games. Devon were out-hit and outfielded in last night's game.

The game was marked by heavy hitting with the result that "Snap" Thompson, along with "Nobby" McLenahan will get the second suit of clothes donated by James P. Farrell of the Royal Stores for hitting for the circuit. McLenahan won the first suit a week ago on a ball hit also on the Devon diamond. E. Miles, the Devon first-sacker also hit for the circuit last evening.

Neither hit was clean as grass in the deep outfield of the Devon diamond is tall and the ball is easily lost once it gets through the fielder. This grass should be cut.

Eddie Dinsmore of the Imps and "Johns" Keene, of Devon were the rival slabmen, and each pitched good ball. Dinsmore had the edge on Keene by one hit and Keene was as wild as a hawk, having four wild pitches chalked by against him. Three of Keene's four strikeouts came in the last inning.

"Snaky" Bailey was injured in the first inning when his head came in contact with Kierstead's outting, resulting in a nasty rash on the patch on his forehead. He had to leave the game.

"Raggy" Shannon, Shannon, and with the help of the other three, each had a couple of hits in a good game. The return to the top floor seemed to give the Imps a new lease of life. Garvie was used at third and did well at the hot corner, which is a new position for him.

Fredericton started well. McLenahan started out well, and the first batter was walked. Shannon, not to be outdone by his teammate McLenahan, and a high fly to the man's position. They got a suit of clothes when a high fly came to the left, the ball was hit to the left, and he made the catch with Cain ahead of him. Garvie went out on a high fly to Malloy. Kierstead singled and Jack Watson let the ball get away from him and Kierstead went to third. McLenahan sent out a high fly which Malloy got under

and Kierstead was thrown out at the plate when he tried to score on the play. In the third, after Cain and Thompson were easy infield outs, Rutter singled, Kierstead hit for two bases and Rutter scored. Kierstead stole third and scored when Keene uncorked a wild pitch. Two more runs were added in the fifth, both on wild heaves by Keene. Cain went out, pitcher to first. Thompson singled, went to second on a wild pitch. Rutter was thrown out at first by "Kato" Keene. Kierstead singled and Thompson scored. Malloy made a poor throw and Kierstead was safe on second. Keene's second pitch of the inning put him on third. Eddie

Lawrence tossed McLenahan's grounder high to first and Kierstead scored.

The last run of the game and the one which won the game for the Imps came in the sixth. A hit by Garvie, a passed ball by H. Miles and a hit by Cain produced the run.

Devon Overtakes Lead in Third

Devon scored a run in the second stanza. "Happy" Watson singled to center. Thompson let the ball get through him and Watson made the tally. In the third Devon scored five runs. Lawrence, the first batter was hit by Dinsmore. J. Watson hit. "Kato" Keene was walked and the bases were loaded. E. Miles duplicated Thompson's feat of the first inning by hitting a four-ply wallop and four runs came in. Miles' hit also was lost in the grass in leftfield. H. Keene was passed. Malloy popped to Dinsmore. K. Watson singled. H. Miles sent a high fly to McLenahan and Keene scored. Cain made a bad heave of McLenahan's relay and Watson went to third, when he tied the score on the play; he was caught at the plate, Donovan to Dinsmore.

Devon never threatened after that. A double play by Fredericton spoiled three chances in the fifth. With Lawrence on second base in the last inning with two down, "Nobby" McLenahan made a nice running catch of O. Keene's long fly and the game was over.

"Johns" Keene was inclined to use the spitball in last night's game, Fredericton howled, but umpire-in-chief Lister claimed to have no authority to prevent it. The York County League is played under rules governing National Association baseball and only certain pitchers are allowed to use the so-called spitball.
