INVESTIGATION SURE

Rome, July 16-That there will be full inquiry into the causes of the disaster to General Umberto Nobile's polar dirigible the Italia, is taken for granted in official circles here. It was stated that this inquiry will be conducted as soon as practicable and that an early and full investigation would be to the general's own interest.

The report in the Stockholm news paper Dageblat that General Nobile is held on the base ship Citta di Milano as virtually a captive of the Italian government is scoffed at here.

Intimations in Russian newspapers. that the leader of the expedition abandoned his men, is treated here as a piece of scurrilous libel.

The point is that the general is too ill yet to give a report.
