

5 YEARS OF SOBRIETY IS DISPUTED

St. Louis, July 16—Every opportunity will be given the sisters of Vincent Kerens to contest in circuit court here next September his claim to "five consecutive years of sobriety." P. Taylor Bryan, counsel for the St. Louis Trust Company, said today.

The sisters, Mrs. Madeline Kenna of New York and Mrs. Gladys Colket of Philadelphia have objected to the willfulness of the trust company to release to Kerens his \$1,900,000 share of the \$7,000,000 estate of his father, the late Richard C. Kerens, former ambassador to Austria-Hungary.

Kerens now engaged in the bond business at Dallas, Tex., served in the A. E. F. air force, was mustered out a captain with three wounds and snow-white hair, and subsequently was married, divorced and married again. Under the terms of the will he was granted an income of \$500 monthly.

Got Vote of Confidence

Bryan declined to divulge the nature of the sister's objections, but said Samuel B. McPheeters, former president of the St. Louis police board, conducted an investigation of Kerens' claims to sobriety—as stipulated in his father's will—and gave him a vote of confidence.

Three previous applications submitted by Kerens in the 12 years which followed his father's death were refused by the trust company. When he finally won approval, the trust company was confronted by the objections of the sisters and petitioned the circuit court for authority, admitting it was "beset by doubts as to its duty."

Cut lettuce into shreds with the scissors, season with salt. Put on slices buttered brown bread, add slices of hard boiled eggs spread with salad dressing and cover with bread.

Jelly
Butter the bread spread with lettuce cheese and jelly. Cover with bread and serve.

PICNIC EGGS DEVILED

Mash the yolks off hard cooked eggs season with salt pepper butter or butter substitute a little mustard and vinegar. Minced potted ham may be added or the yolks may be mixed with mayonnaise dressing. Refill the whites with the mixture press two halves together and wrap each egg in a square of oiled paper the ends of which are twisted to keep the halves in place.

SUMMER LUNCHEON SANDWICH

Bread
Butter
Lettuce
Tomatoes
