King's County Agricultural Society Send 200 Delegates to Experimental Farm — Hon. G. B. Jones Speaker.

Two hundred members of the Sussex Agricultural Society, filling over forty cars, travelled the longest distance of any such society yet to visit the Experimental Station here today and the first visit of that society to the station.

Had Luncheon

At noon the visitors were entertained at luncheon in the Agricultural Hall and several speakers were heard. Among the speakers were M. A. MacLeod, editor of the Maritime Farmer, who was in charge of the party; C. F. Bailey, superintendent of the Experimental Station; Mr. McDougall agricultural representative for the Sussex district; A. E. McLaurem of the Live Stock division of the Provincial Department of Agriculture; the Hon. George B. Jones, M. P. for Royal; J. D. McKenna, president of the N. B. Publishing Co.

Toured Farm

After luncheon the delegates were taken about the farm. The ladies were shown the poultry and the flowers and vegetables. The men were shown the farm and the experimental work in corn culture and potato culture was pointed out. The visitors left for home at about four-thirty o'clock this afternoon.

Heat Wave Again

In some places the temperature has reached as high as 110; several places in the States averaging 100 degrees in the shade. Many places in Fredericton and locality show temperatures of over 80. The maximum in this city was reached last week, when the thermometer rose to 90 degrees.

MAY EXTEND LIGHT SYSTEM TO SPRINGHILL

Residents of Progressive Rural Section Petition the Maritime Electric Company — The Matter Now Under Consideration.

It is possible that in the near future the Maritime Electric Company in carrying out its policy of expansion may extend its electric lighting system through the Parish of Kingsclear as far as Springhill. Not long ago the lighting system was extended to the residence of Mr. Hamilton G. Kitchen, who lives on the back road just above the city limits. People residing above that point, however, while up to date in all other respects still have to worry along with oil lamps, a relic of a past age and are getting tired of it. Quite recently they petitioned the Maritime Electric Company, and it is understood that every householder between the city limits and Springhill on both sides of the road signed the petition and agreed to avail themselves of the service if it is installed.
