MOTOR VEHICLE REVENUE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR WILL RUN OVER THE MILLION MARK

The Province of New Brunswick's Fines 438.95 2,101.07
revenue from Motor Vehicles for the fiscal year ended October 31st 1928 was over one million dollars, according to announcement made today by Hon. D. A. Stewart, Minister of Public Works.

Motor Vehicle license receipts amounted to \$739,230.74 during the fiscal year just closed these figures being a new high mark for New Brunswick and almost \$120,000 more than in 1927 when the gross receipts from license fees amounted to \$619,895.26. Receipts for 1928 from licenses were estimated at \$650,000. Fines collected under the Motor Vehicle Act during the past year amounted to \$2,101.07 as compared with \$438.95 in 1927 thus further swelling the margin of the past year's receipts over the previous year.

When returns are all in for gasoline tax, in respect to the month of October, Hon. Mr. Stewart said the revenue from this source would be shown to be more than \$270,000 the actual cash receipts up to October 31st 1928 being \$251,543.90 and, although tax payments in respect to October are not yet due more than \$20,000 has already been paid in as for the past month. This insures a total revenue for the Motor Vehicle Branch of more than \$1,000,000 where, as the estimated revenue from license receipts and gasoline tax was \$970,000.

to the cenotaph where the memorial service will be held, commencing at 10.30 o'clock. As soon as the service is completed, which will be about eleven o'clock, the veterans will parade to the cemeteries at the entrance to the city and take part in the decoration of the graves of the deceased war veterans. The veterans will return down King street to Westmorland and down Queen street to the Legion quarters.

Two Minutes Silence.

The program at the cenotaph is in ample time for the citizens to attend the church services which follow at eleven o'clock. His Worship Mayor Clark will open the service at the cenotaph with a few brief introductory remarks. Those assembled will sing the hymn "O God Our Help in Ages Past", which will be followed by a prayer by Rev. George Telford, of the St. Paul's United church. Then will come the reading of the honor roll by Sergeant Major Augustus Fowler. The address appropriate to the occasion will be given by Very Rev. Dean Scovil Neales. Previous to the two minutes of silence which will be observed by bowed heads and complete silence, there will be the placing of floral wreaths.

The will come the two minutes of silence and Bugler Seymour Tyler will sound the "Last Post". The benediction will be pronounced by Very Rev. Dean Neales, and the service will end with the sounding of the "Reveille" by the bugler and the singing of the National Anthem by all present.

Growth of Receipts

It was pointed out by Hon. Mr. Stewart that receipts from Motor Vehicle License fees of \$730,230.74 were almost double the receipts from the same source five years ago, the total receipts in 1923 being \$376,966.19.

In this connection the following table showing the receipts from Motor Vehicle License Fees in New Brunswick, showing a steady and continuous growth from a beginning of \$84. in 1905 will be of interest:—

Gasoline Tax Receipts

Gasoline tax receipts for the fiscal year closed October 31st, 1928 will exceed \$275,000, Hon. Mr. Stewart stated as compared with \$239,956.29 in 1927.

Cash receipts up to October 31st for the year just closed reached \$251,543.90 or \$11,587.61 more than in 1927, and since October 31st more than \$20,000 has already been received in respect to gasoline tax for October.

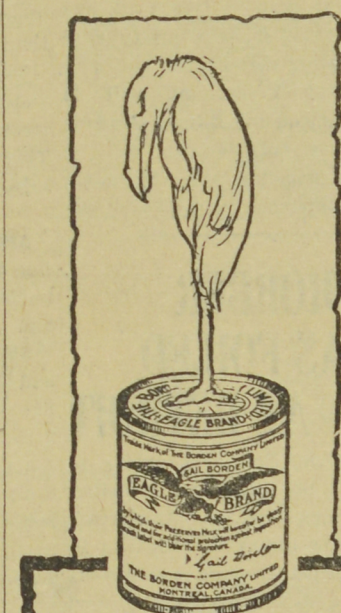
