More Encouraging Report On His Majesty's Condition

Bulletin Issued This Morning Says That He Had a Fair Night With Quieter Sleep Toward Morning-His Local Condition Has Improved But General State is Not So Satisfactory.

(Special to The Daily Mail by the British United Press.)

LONDON, Dec. 28-The physicians attending King George issued the first morning bulletin on the King's condition in several days today. The bulletin said: "The King had a fair night with quieter sleep toward morning. There is less difficulty in taking nourishment and the general state has improved during the last twelve hours.

"At a consultation held this morning the progress during the past week was reviewed during that period there has been definite improvement in the local condition. On the other hand, the general condition, as evidenced by the King's weight and strength, does not show the same progress.

"Measures best adapted for meeting this difficulty were considered and determined upon.

Rosario Javicoli Offered Editorship of Sao. Paulo Paper.

JOB VACANT **THREE MONTHS**

Defamatory Articles Re sulted in Destruction of the Plant.

(Special to THE DAILY MAIL by the British United Press.) Rome, Dec. 28-Rosario Javiçoli, formerly chief of the Press Bureau of the Ministry of the Interior, has been offered the position of editor at Sao Paulo, Brazil.

The position has been vacant since September 24th, when Brazilian students raided the newspaper and signed by Uniggi Freddi, then editor of the newspaper Combat.

The students alleged the articles were defamatory to Brazilian womannood and contained offensive comments against the Brazilian people. Brazilian newspaper blamed Freddi Lieutenant Governor of New Bruns- a Fascist for the entire affair and demanded that he be deported. Javicoli will embark for Sao

Government forces, the dispatches said, have demolished the plant after articles continued their advances and have pursued the insurgents along the Charikar Road, about seventeen miles from Kabul. Airplanes bombarded several forts still in the rebels hands in the Charikar Valley.


