COAL MINING PROPERTIES  
IN GRAND LAKE DISTRICT TO  
BE ACQUIRED BY U.S. CONCERN

Company Formed With New York Charter and Capitalized at \$2,500,000—To Generate Electricity at the Pit's Mouth—Shale and Other By-Products to be Utilized.

Minto Mines, Incorporated is the name of a new corporation which has been formed and chartered under the laws of the State of New York to bring about an amalgamation of a number of the principal coal mining properties in New Brunswick by consolidating title to a large area of the Grand Lake coal district. Recent investigations and findings in connection with the treatment of bituminous coal, including the possibilities of liquified coal as a source of power, are regarded as likely to have an important bearing in connection with the future of the Grand Lake district, where coal reserves of over 200 million tons of good steam-producing quality are available according to geological reports. Properties involved in the amalgamation proposed for Minto Mines Incorporated include about 80 per cent of the best coal lands in the Grand Lake district and are largely located in the southern portions of the territory; in the list are the holdings of Harvey Welton, Rothwell Coal Company, Welton & Henderson, Mid-


