

## ONTARIO'S LEAD PRODUCTION. WATER-POWER DEVELOPMENT

All the lead produced in Ontario, some 3,700 tons or about 2½ per cent of the Canadian production in 1926 is obtained from the mine at Galetta near Arnprior on the Ottawa river.

## SIX FAMILIES OF SETTLERS ARRIVE IN NEW BRUNSWICK; A TRIPARTE ARRANGEMENT

Six families from Great Britain, comfortable new homes on farms which Britain, totalling more than fifty were completely stocked and equipped for them in New Brunswick,

thus marking the successful inauguration of the first British families settled scheme entered into by any Provincial Government of this Dominion with the Imperial and Canadian Governments participating. They are the the vanguard of 500 selected families who will be brought out to New Brunswick from the British Isles during the ensuing five years covered by the tripartite agreement, which provides for 100 selected families being settled in this Province each year for the next five years under the most favorable conditions ever offered selected immigrants from Great Britain to Canada. The first families arriving averaged eight children to a family and if this average is maintained the population addition will be more than it was anticipated the scheme would provide.

The first five of the families to set foot on Canadian soil arrived at Halifax on Saturday and Sunday. They were all from the North of Ireland and are typical of the sturdy agricultural class of the North of Ireland, apparently prepared to meet the new conditions of their lives with confidence and that determination which spells success. The men are young and robust and sinewy and quite evidently the out-of-doors type, the women are strong and apparently prepared to do their part in establishing the families under their new conditions and the children are bright, alert youngsters. The New Brunswick government's superintendent of immigration, Hon. J. A. Murray, a former Premier of the Province met the new arrivals at Halifax with representatives of the Farm Settlement Branch of the Federal Government and the Canadian National Railways and New Brunswick's newest citizens were assured that everyone with whom they would come in contact in New Brunswick, government officials and private citizens, would be found anxious to help them in every way possible.

## A War Veteran

The other British family to arrive disembarked at Saint John from the Canadian Pacific Steamship Montserrat today and came from Bedfordshire, England. The head of this family of five is James H. Walker, who has been engaged in farming in England since the War. He is a former soldier in the Imperial Army and at the outbreak of the Great War was at Gibraltar, enroute to Africa and later to France, arriving there in time to participate in the first battle of Ypres, which commenced on October 14, 1914. The regiment was part of the "Old Contemptibles" who bore the brunt of the first onslaught of the Germans. Mr. Walker went through the whole campaign until the armistice without a scratch. He comes from a family of soldiers, one of his brothers being a regimental sergeant major with 24 years service; another was killed in the war. The family's new home is at Cady, Queens County.

The Provincial Government under the New Settlement Scheme buys the farms, which are sold to the settlers at actual cost, the amount repayable over a period of 25 years with interest at five per cent. amortized. The British Government advances an amount not exceeding \$1,500 for stock and equipment on the same basis of repayments as the purchase of the farms.

The Dominion Government through its organization in the British Isles, makes the selection of the settler and with its organization in Canada and with co-operation of the Provincial Government receives them on their arrival, places them on the properties to which they have been allocated and gives them the necessary after care and advice as to their farming operations.

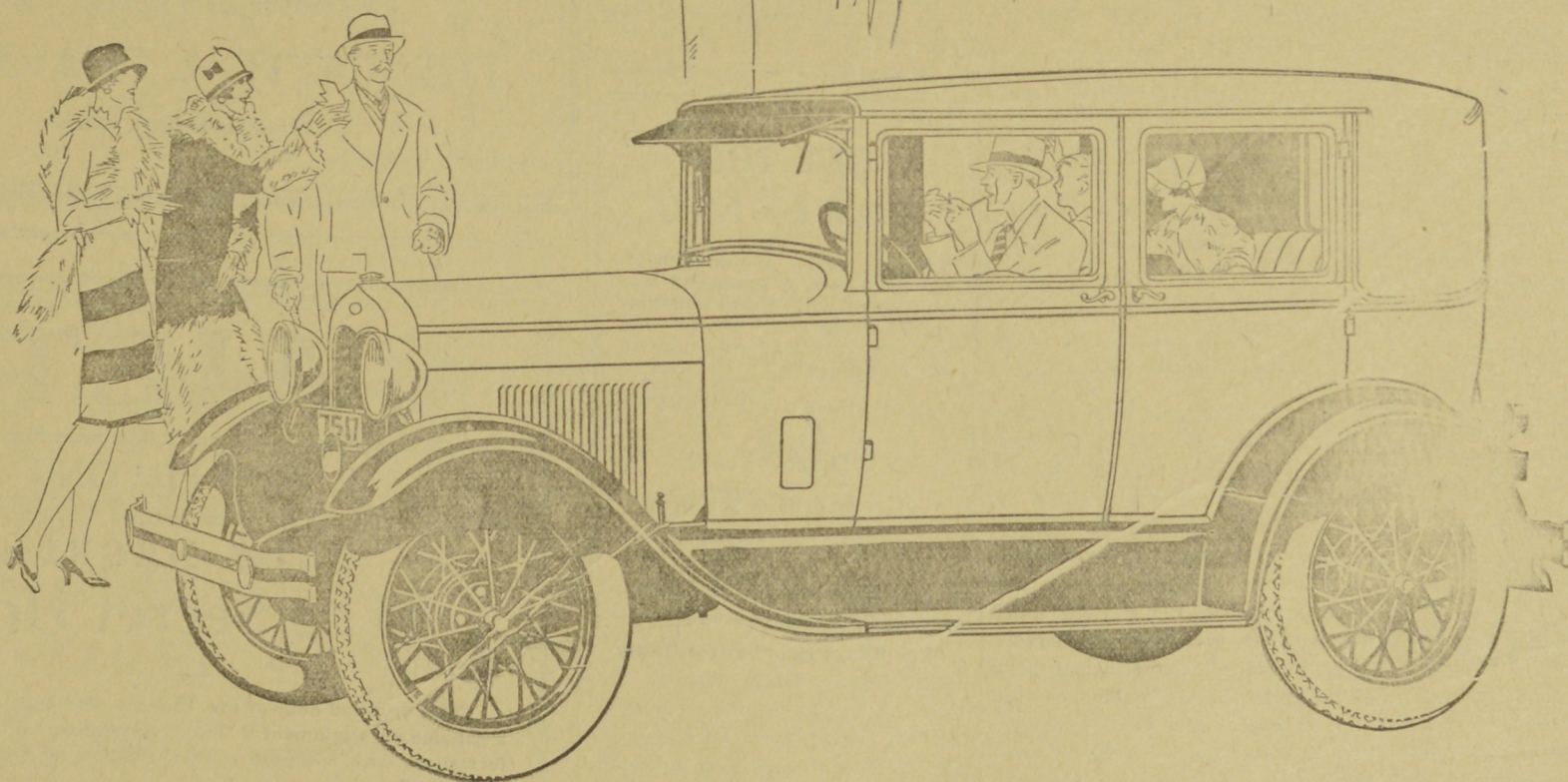

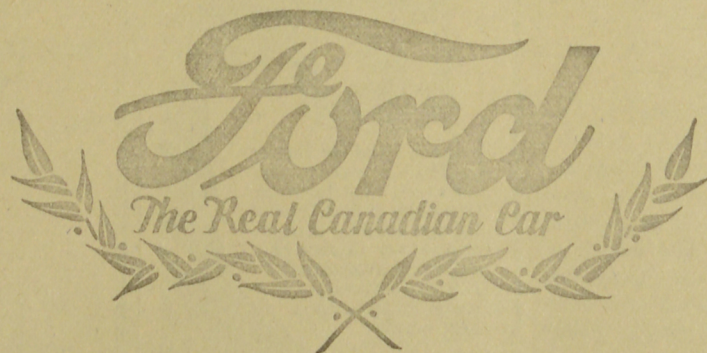
