Experts were among many Europeans called in by Kemal to make a thorough estimate of the wealth to be secured from the sale of the Sultans riches Jewels and rare objects of most daz zling profusion were described by the lapidaries, among which are scores of big emeralds, one of which is large enough to contain a bonbon box sunk in the middle.

The objects contain hundreds of rock crystal, perfume flasks, manuscripts, Turkish and Persian carvings and gold filigreed work, priceless antique rugs, objects in ivory and ebony including one ebony cane of the former Sultan entirely encrusted with
