Quebec.—Quebec is taking advantage of the Federal legislation of last year known as the Canadian Farm Loan Act, which provides for loans to pioneers whereby the Federal Government provides 90% of the money, the province 5% and borrower himself the remain-

This years largest inflow of settlers destined for the west re-cently arrived on two of the liners of the Canadian Pacific fleet. There were 1082 on the Montelare and 800 on the Melita, the majority being of British birth, thereby establishing a record for any individual ship docking at the Maritime Prov ince ports this year.
