HARRY HEILMAN LEADS AMERICAN LEAGUE AT BAT

Batted For .398 For Season—Simmons Close Second—Babe and Buster Close Behind.

New York, Jan. 11—Harry Heilmann of Detroit is named champion batsman of the American League in the official averages released for publication today but the names of Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig the latter the league's most valuable player of 1927 figure prominently in the various groups of statistics.

The reason for the easy victory of the New York Yankees in last season's race is plain as Miller Huggins' club led the league in team batting number of hits, total bases three baggers and homers and runs scored.

Heilmann's batting average was .398 with Al Simmons of the Athletics closest competitor with .392.

Gehrig led the league at hitting two baggers and in total bases. Combs of the Yankees led in three-base hits and Babe Ruth in home runs with his new record of 60. Gehrig hit 47 homers.

Fusiliers—Goal, Wilson; defence, Fraser and Bartlett; forwards, Ferguson, Keating, Clark, Thompson and Kiley.

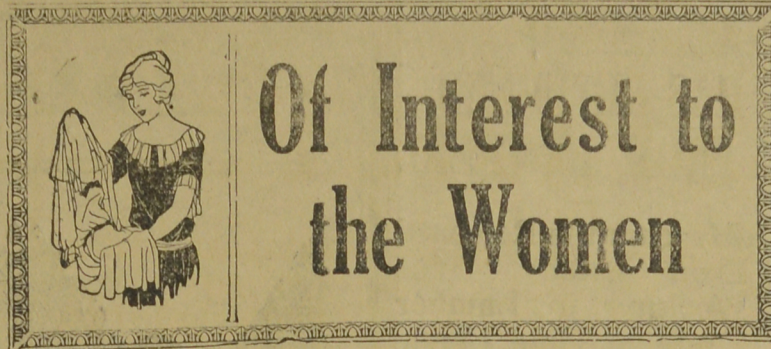

White velveteen fashions stunning new cardigans for sports. They may be stitched fancily in color or may grow nautical with brass buttons.

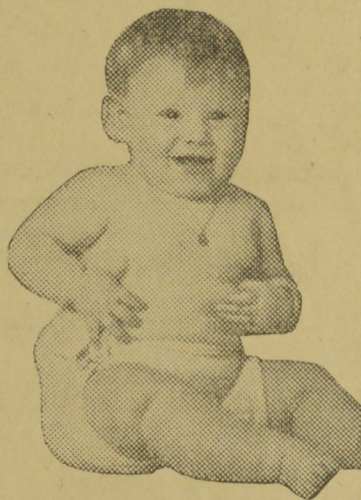
Dance handkerchiefs are huge almost as big as a man's. They come in fragile chiffon and lace. A cherry red chiffon one has a modernistic pink pattern.

SALMON SALAD.

- 1 package lemon gelatin
- 2 cups boiling water
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1-4 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup red salmon
- 1 cup green peas
- 1 cup carrots diced

Remove two tablespoons of the measured boiling water add lemon juice and salt and dissolve gelatin pour a little gelatin in the bottom of a mold and chill. When it begins to thicken press in the salmon and let this layer harden. Then add another layer of gelatin and the green peas. When firm add a last layer

- 2 cups boiling water
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 3 tablespoons lemon juice
- Few grains salt

Mix the cornstarch and sugar together. Add the boiling water slowly while stirring constantly. Let boil to cook the cornstarch thoroughly. When cooked and slightly thickened remove from the fire and add the lemon juice, butter and salt. Stir well and serve hot over the apple dumplings.

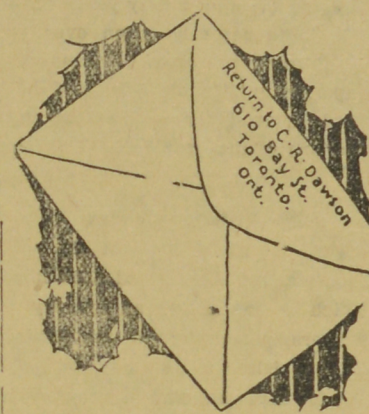
Note—Apple dumplings may also be baked at 400 degrees for 40 minutes.

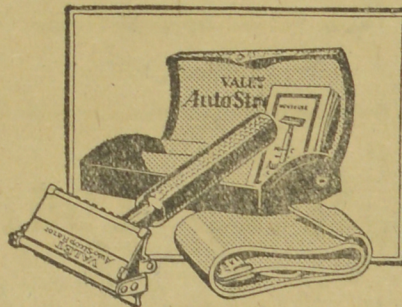
