According to tentative plans of the Senate of the University of New Brunswick, the new Beaverbrook Residence building which was a gift to the local university from Lord and the late lamented Lady Beaverbrook, will be run in a similar manner as is employed in similar colleges in other parts of the country. It is planned that by the time the building is ready for us, an organization will have been formed to take charge and arrange for proper carrying on of dwelling for students.

The committee selected for this matter, Chancellor C. C. Jones, J. E. Page and Miss Hazen Allen are at present engaged in this work and will secure information from other colleges about the matter. In the meantime plans for the induction ceremonies are being arranged and the opening will take place early in 1929. Work at the building is progressing favorably and finishing inside work will be done during the coming winter season.

LICENSE MAY BE CANCELLED FOR ONE FULL YEAR

Fast Driving Was the Cause of Death of Alvah Johnston Was the Verdict at Oromocto — Five Witnesses.

Fast driving was the decision given by the jury appointed to look into the cause of the death of little Alvah Johnston, son of Mr. and Mrs. Murray Johnston who was struck by an automobile driven by Alden Clark of St. John and killed on his way to school on Monday morning at Lincoln. The recommendation was made that Clark's driver license be suspended for one year to go into effect from the present date. The inquest was held last night at Oromocto with Alexander Barnett, Oromocto merchant acting as coroner. Clark was defended by J. J. F. Winslow, K. C.

BEARS HAVE A HUNGRY TIME THIS SEASON

Scarcity of Beechnuts and Blueberries Has Made Bruin Dependant on Orchards and Farm Yards.

While the numerous reports of the ravages of bears which have come in from the rural districts during the present season are apt to create the impression that these animals are becoming very plentiful, the fact remains that they are not as numerous as was the case twenty or thirty years ago. At least this is the view of a well known lumberman whose duties take him to different parts of the province and quite frequently into the woods. He points out that a lot of bears, at least enough to account for the 1928 output, have been trapped and shot since early last spring and it is easy therefore to make the deduction that there are no more bears at large in the woods at the present time than was the case in the autumn of 1927. He holds that it is the great scarcity this year of food on which the animals subsist, such as beechnuts and blueberries, that is making bruin so bold and ravenous.

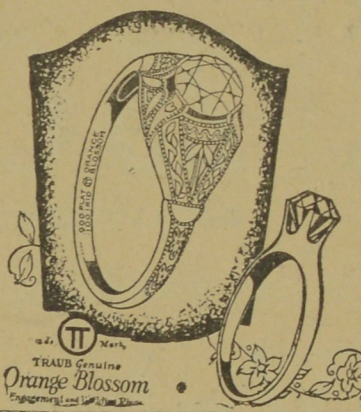
