CHOCOLATE ICE CREAM

- 2 cups milk
- 2 cups cream or evaporated
- 1 1-4 cups sugar
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch 1-8 teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs
- 2 squares chocolate, melted 1 tablespoon vanilla

Mix milk, cream, sugar, starch salt and eggs. Cook in double boiler until slightly thickened, add the chocolate and let it cool. Add vanilla and freeze.

### BUTTERSCOTCH COOKIES

2 cups brown sugar 1 cup corn oil 2 eggs 3 1-2 cups flour 1-2 teaspoon cream of tartar 1-2 teaspoon soda 1-2 teaspoon salt 1 tablespoon vanilla 1-2 cup finely chopped nuts Cream sugar and corn oil add eggs well beaten, sift dry ingredients and add all together. Mix well. Add flavoring. Make into long roll and let stand overnight in cool place. In the morning slice in thin slices and bake. Makes about six dozen cookies.
