

HON. MR. BENNETT
TO BE HERE ON
AUGUST 18TH

Will Likely Remain Over Sunday in the City—To Speak at the Arctic Rink on Saturday Evening.

It is likely that Hon. R. B. Bennett, K. C., M. P., will spend Sunday, August 19th in this city. He is to speak at St. Stephen on Friday the 17th and on the following day will motor to this city. On Saturday evening he will address a mass meeting in the Arctic rink, which is capable of accommodating three thousand people. Should the weather be favorable there is no doubt that the rink will be crowded to capacity.

On Monday, the Conservative leader will motor to Woodstock where he is to address a public meeting in the evening. On Tuesday he will motor back to Fredericton and proceed by auto to Chatham, arriving there in time for a public meeting in the evening.

Hon. Mr. Bennett is now in Cape Breton, and when he leaves there this week for Prince Edward Island he will have spoken in every county in the province.

On August 14th he is to speak at the unveiling of a monument at Fort Beauséjour and in the evening will be at Moncton.

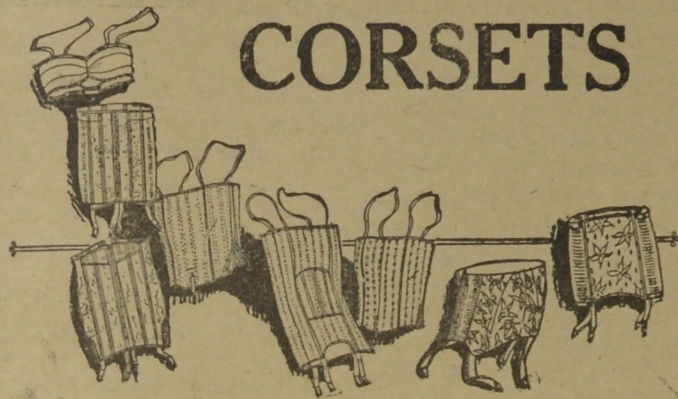
