Canned tomatoes

- 1 tablespoon granulated gelatin
- 1-2 tablespoon sugar
- Bit of bay leaf
- 3-4 tablespoon leman juice Leaves from 1 stalk celery

Drain juice from tomatoes. To one cup juice add the gelatin, sugar bay leaf, lemon juice and celery leaves. Stir until boiling point is reached and gelatin is dissolved and strain.
