

ELDERS WERE ORDAINED AT SAINT PAUL'S

The Morning Service on Sunday by Pastor Telford Was Very Interesting and Impressive

The morning service of the St Paul's United Church yesterday was of unique and impressive character, when the four elders recently elected by the congregation were solemnly ordained by the minister Rev. George Telford. The sermon for the occasion was based on the text "Thou art Peter and on this rock will I build my Church." The minister proceeded to describe the institution and character of the eldership in the Christian Church. The sermon was closed with a strong appeal for the enlistment of all of the man power of the church for Christian service.

At the close of the address the elders, Messrs. V. A. Harshaw, William Kesson, C. L. Sypher and Harry A. Watson, were called forward and the duties of the session as described in the basis of Union were then read. The customary questions were asked and these having been answered, the elders elect knelt down and were solemnly ordained by the moderator, the pastor.

In New Robes

An interesting feature of the service was that the minister wore for the first time new pulpit robes presented to him by the Ladies' Air Society of the church. These robes consisting of the Geneva gown and cassock are of rich black silk and are the work of Harcourt of Toronto. In expressing appreciation of the gift, the minister pointed out that the Geneva gown had always been associated with the services of the Presbyterian church. Mr. Telford complimented the donors of the robes on the high reverence and esteem which their gift expressed for the dignity of the office of the Christian ministry.

He made the acquaintance of a number of people here who were greatly impressed with his fine physique and genial personality.

A BOY SCOUT REWARDED FOR ACT OF HEROISM

Silver Cross Presented to Robert V. Wilby by Governor Todd at the Opera House Saturday Evening.

On Saturday evening on the closing night of the Young People's Community show, Scout Robert Vernon Wilby son of Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Wilby of Springhill, was called to the platform and presented with the silver cross, the Boy Scout second class award for life saving. The presentation was made by His Honor the Lieutenant Governor who spoke briefly on the import of the medal and of the deserving praise of the scout who risked his life in the saving of eight year old Phillip Goodine from the river at Springhill early this winter.

The presentation was made on behalf of the Boy Scout Association who, as soon as they learned of the brave act of the boy, immediately formed a court of honor and took steps in the matter of securing the award from the Medal Board of the Scout Association.

An Heroic Act.

The heroic act of Scout Wilby occurred early this winter at Springhill at the time of the high water level in the St. John. Young Goodine had fallen through the ice and was struggling helplessly in the water, when Wilby happened along, took the nearest route over the ice to the drowning boy. But the ice was in a weak condition and Wilby also fell through. However, after a hard struggle he succeeded in getting the boy to the bank of the river, where after wrapping his own coat around him he took him to his home. A curious part of the incident was that the rescuer said nothing about the rescue, merely stating when asked that it was just a "Boy Scout 'turn'". Investigation by the Scout Association disclosed the facts of the rescue and as a result Wilby is receiving the reward of his heroic act.

ASSESSMENT MAY BE SAME AS LAST YEAR

City Council Will Meet in Committee This Evening to Order it—School Board is Not Likely to Get Increase.

It is believed now that the City Council will be able to keep the assessment for the year within last year's total. At least this was the view expressed by an alderman this morning in reply to a question. He said that the city school board had applied for an amount \$4,000 in excess of the appropriation of last year but the council did not feel disposed to accede to this request. The statement of receipts and expenditure for last year had been carefully gone over and the conclusion had been arrived at that an additional grant was not needed. The chairmen of the different departments have been busy of late preparing their estimates and have a pretty good idea of the total amount which will be needed to carry on the machinery of government.

The council will meet in committee this evening to order the assessment and transact such other business as will come before it. It was stated today that an arrangement has been made for the opening of a tourist information bureau in the Exhibition office in Phoenix Square with Mr. C. L. Sypher in charge. A committee has been working on the matter for some days and will submit a report to the council this evening.

Fires Over Week-End

The fire department had a busy session over the week-end, being called out to four fires, two on Saturday and on Sunday, and one early this morning. None were of a serious nature. An alarm box from 16 rung in Sunday morning about 7:30 o'clock, the department extinguished a fire at the residence of Phillip Pincombe at the corner of Northumberland and George streets. Two fires on Saturday, one at the residence of Harry Moore on King street and another at the residence of William McCann on Aberdeen street Saturday evening. This morning the fire apparatus responded to a call to the residence of Mrs. Edna Wilson on George street. All the fires were extinguished without much difficulty.

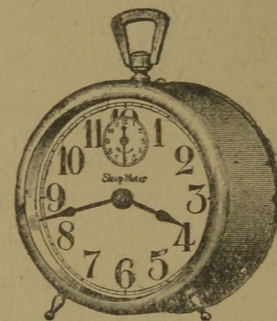
