**Will Erect Sign**  
Upon motion by Alderman Currier seconded by Alderman Bull at the city council meeting last night, the Fredericton Motor Sales were given permission to erect an electric sign in front of their place of business at 644 Queen street. The work is to be done under the direction and to the satisfaction of the city engineer, J. D. MacKay.

**Firemen Given Grant**  
Upon motion made by Alderman Bull, seconded by Alderman Goodspeed, the city fire department were granted the sum of \$100 to defray expenses of the recent Chautauqua showing here. Alderman Bull announced that the show did not turn out as successful as expected and as result the firemen were under the amount which they hoped to realize. He thought that the firemen should be given this sum in appreciation of their splendid work in the past year or two.

### SEIZURE MADE OF 30 GALLONS OF ALCOHOL

Prov. Police Seize Contraband Stuff in Restigouche—Hunter Shot Deer Out of Season, Will be Prosecuted.

The Provincial Police headquarters in this city report the seizure of upwards of thirty gallons of alcohol at Atholville, in Restigouche county on Monday of this week. The seizure was effected at about nine o'clock on Monday evening by Constable Muir and though every effort was made to capture those in possession of the contraband they managed to make their getaway. The contraband is now in safe keeping.

**Shot Deer Tuesday.**  
Another offence, this one against the provincial game laws was brought to light yesterday at Woodstock and is now being prosecuted. The offence was the shooting of a deer following the closing of the game season. The discovery of the carcass was made at Woodstock yesterday by Provincial Police officers and game warden Gibson of Debec. The arrest of the hunter was made at the same time and the case will be prosecuted by the Chief

### PRESBYTERY COMPLETED WORK HERE YESTERDAY

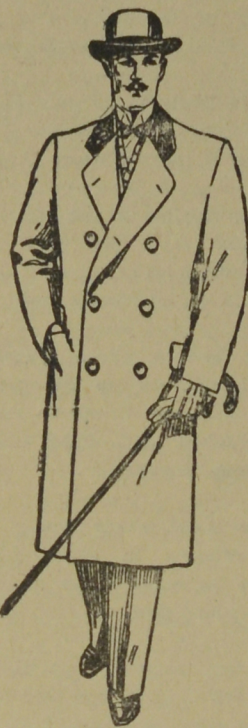
Concluded with Interesting Lecture by Dr. Palmer of Mt. Allison Last Night—Mt. Allison Fund Campaign.

The quarterly meeting of the Fredericton Presbytery of the United Church of Canada concluded its meeting last night at the Fraser Memorial Hall with a lecture given by Dr. J. M. Palmer, principal of Mount Allison University. George T. Bradley, of Durham Bridge, Prof. A. F. Baird, of this city, and Rev. F. H. Holmes, the three commissioners of the Winnipeg council gave reports at the afternoon meeting yesterday. There was a large attendance at the afternoon meeting.

The chief matter to occupy the attention of the Presbytery in the afternoon was the Mt. Allison University Fund Campaign, which calls for the sum of one million dollars for work on new buildings. Dr. J. M. Palmer, principal of the university headed a delegation to come before the Presbytery in the interests of this fund. Various reports on different routine matters were heard during the day. It was learned that the sum of \$12,000
