

## PRACTICAL CARE NOT PREACHING SAYS PROFESSOR

Dr. W. C. Keirstead Urges Scientific Treatment of Problem of Sub-Normal at Western Baptist Association Meetings in Devon.

That there is a great need for practical ministry other than the mere preaching of doctrine in connection with the problem of the sub-normal, was urged by Dr. W. C. Keirstead, of the University of New Brunswick, in his address on the "Problem of the Sub-Normal" delivered at the annual meeting of the Western Baptist Association held in the South Devon Baptist Church yesterday afternoon. Professor Keirstead pointed out the relation between the feeble-minded and sub-normal and the criminal and said that it was a Christian duty to approach this problem with all the possible help of science and yet with a spirit of kindness and love. Psychological injury, sometimes due to physical injury or defect and emotional complexes lay behind most feeble-mindedness. There could be some help given by an improvement in environment and effort must be made to get at the cause of the thing and to prevent the occurrence of feeble minded and sub-normal children.

### Meetings Opened.

The meetings opened yesterday afternoon with a large number of delegates from all over western N. B. in attendance. A devotional service followed by the Report of the officers by Rev. W. P. Stiles. The Rev. W. C. Crowell presided. Though the ministerial ranks have not been greatly depleted during the year there has been a loss of many prominent members and deacons. In recognition of their

#### Very Small Market

Despite the fine weather there was a very small gathering of farmers at the Phoenix Square market this morning. The farmers are in probability taking advantage of the clear warm weather to finish up seeding operations. Practically the only produce in the market was, veal, butter, fish. Veal sold for 10 and 16 cents; butter for 30 cents a pound; fresh mackerel for 40 cents a piece and lobsters for 25 cents a lb.

#### Cars Smashed

A large closed McLaughlin car and a Ford Coupe were badly smashed in a collision which occurred last night at a late hour near Westfield Beach. The cause of the accident is not known exactly, but it is surmised that the cars were travelling at a fairly good rate of speed and locked mudguards. The lighter car was driven into the banking on the side of the road and was in a very battered condition. The larger vehicle suffered a broken wheel and damage to the radiator. Both automobiles carried New Brunswick license tags.

## W. I. DELEGATES ENTERTAINED AT LUNCHEON

Go to Experimental Station to See Buildings — Education For Mothers urged by Speaker Last Night.

The delegates attending the 16th annual convention of the Women's Institutes were taken this morning to the Dominion Experimental station by car where they were shown the farm lands and buildings and entertained at lunch. The luncheon gathering was addressed by E. M. Taylor, assistant Superintendent of the station. Before leaving for the farm the delegates gathered in the Assembly Chamber where they listened to an address by Mrs. M. E. Lawrence provincial convener of immigration. Mrs. Lawrence said that owing to improved conditions in the Mother Country there were fewer immigrants coming from England and more from Scandinavian countries. These are a fine type of people and it was the duty of the Institute to welcome these people and help them to get used to our customs and to become "Canadianized."

## THE HIGH SCHOOL ENTRANCE EXAMS BEGIN MONDAY

About 175 Candidates Are Expected to Write Papers For Admission to High School — The Schools Close 26th.

The High School Entrance examinations commence on Monday morning of next week and expectations are that there will be approximately the same number of candidates as last year, with the possibility of a few more. The examinations will be written in the usual place, the assembly room of the Provincial Normal School and will be concluded on next Friday. The total number of those writing is expected to be about 175 this year and probably more applications will be received before Monday. Last year there were 173 who wrote the entrance papers. R. D. Hanson, secretary of the School Board will be in charge of the examinations.

Examinations for school teachers' licenses which are now going on in the Provincial Normal School will be concluded on Friday of this week.

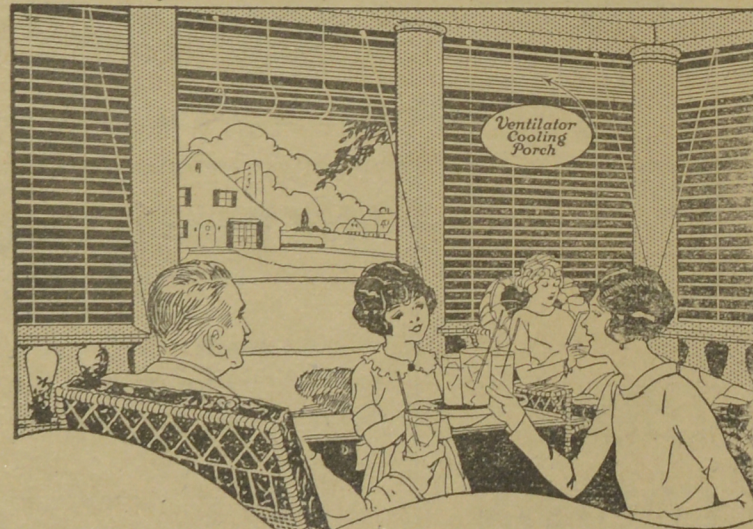

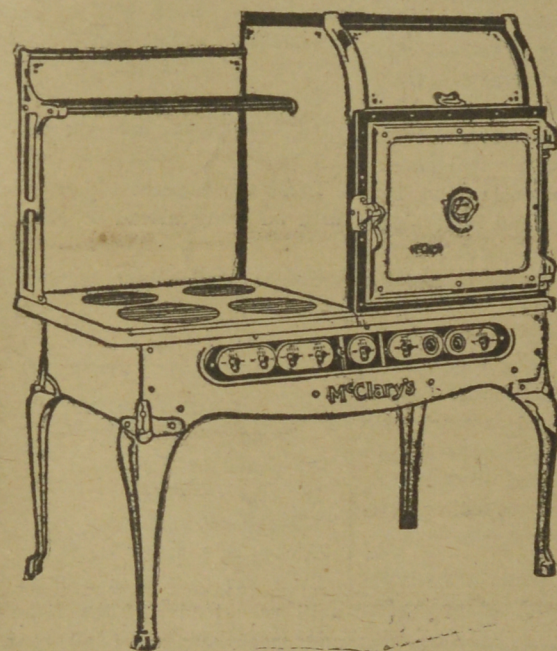
