ORANGE COUNTY CIRCUIT OFFERS 100,000 PURSE

Middleton, N. Y., Feb. 22—The Orange County Circuit, the eastern chain of half-mile trotting tracks that annually draws horses from all sections of the country, will offer a grand total of \$100,000 in purses and premiums this season.

Endicott, Elmira, Goshen and Middleton, N. Y., the four members of the circuit, each will present the following early closing events: \$2,000 free-for-all-trot, \$3,000; 2:10 pace; \$2,000, 2:21 trot, for the first day's program; second day—\$1,000, two-year-old trot; \$3,000, three-year-old trot; \$2,000, 2:15 pace and \$2,000, 2:16 trot; third day—\$3,000, 2:11 trot; \$2,000, 2:26 trot; and \$2,000, 2:05 pace. Races will be staged under the rules of the National Trotting Association. Entries close March 5.

The dates assigned are Endicott, July 24-26; Elmira, July 31-Aug. 2; Goshen, Aug. 7-9 and Middleton, Aug. 14-16. As in the past, a driver will receive \$100 for each race he wins and \$20 will go to the caretaker of each victorious horse.

Many Grand Circuit teamsters are expected to race in the Orange County events as there is a gap in the big line schedule at the time these meetings are held.

OAT MEAL COOKIES

Two cups rolled oats 1 1/4 cups flour 2 eggs 1 cup brown sugar, 1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon, 1 teaspoon soda 1/2 cup raisins, 1/2 cup nut meats 1/2 cup shortening 4 tablespoons sour milk. Cream the sugar and shortening together add the slightly beaten eggs and beat together thoroughly. Add raisins, nuts and sour milk. Mix and sift dry ingredients and rolled oats and combine with other mixture. Drop by spoonfuls on a baking sheet about 1 inch apart. Bake in a moderate oven.

SUGAR COOKIES.

One half cup butter, 1 cup sugar, 2 eggs, 1 tablespoon milk, 3 cups flour, 4 teaspoons baking powder 1 teaspoon vanilla. Cream the butter add sugar gradually then the milk and beaten eggs. Mix thoroughly add sifted dry ingredients and mix to a dough. Turn onto a floured board roll lightly and cut. Bake in a greased pan in a moderate oven until light brown about ten minutes.

BANANA PUDDING.

Line a baking dish with any kind of vanilla cookies, lay a layer of cookies then a layer of bananas until dish is nearly full. Slice the bananas in half lengthwise. Then make a boiled custard using 1 cup sugar, 2 egg yolks, 1 pint of milk, 2 tablespoons cornstarch small piece of butter. Mix eggs, sugar, small piece butter with corn starch and mix into hot milk in a double boiler. Pour

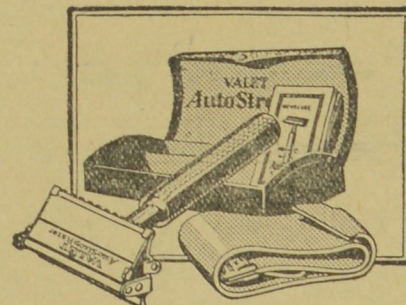
