

## BODY OF LEWIS BURDEN STILL UNRECOVERED

**All Efforts to Discover  
Whereabouts of Miss-  
ing Queensbury Man  
Have Been Fruitless—  
Drowning is Opinion.**

The search for Lewis Burden, farmer of Lower Queensbury, who disappeared from his home on Tuesday, October 16th, and has never been seen or heard from since, still continues, though all hopes of finding him alive have now been abandoned. Officials who have been engaged in the search now feel that the body, if drowning occurred, as seems likely, will not be found until the spring when the body will probably be washed up on the banks of the river.

During the past few weeks, intensive search has been kept up around the home from where the farmer disappeared and along the banks of the river. Grappling irons which were used in the river at the back of the man's home, have now been withdrawn, though strict watch is being kept on the river banks in case of the appearance of the body along the shores.

Every effort was made following Burden's disappearance to get some clue of his whereabouts. At first it was thought that he had wandered into the woods and had got lost; but when a thorough search of the woods in that district brought no results it was feared that the missing man had been drowned. Report later to the effect that a struggling form had been seen in the water below the man's home led further to this belief and the general consensus seems to be that the man met his death by drowning. Burden resided with his cousin, Harry A. Slipp and has other relatives in this city.

## SEIZURE OF CAR AND 80 GALLONS ALCOHOL MADE

**Prov. Police Captured  
New Buick Contain-  
ing Liquor on Wood-  
stock Road Yesterday  
—Men Escaped.**

A seizure, consisting of eighty gallons of alcohol, with an estimated value of nearly \$1000 was made yesterday afternoon by Provincial Police officers of the local detachment in the Parish of Dumfries. The large, evidently brand new Buick Sedan of the de luxe type, which the alcohol was stowed in was also taken by the police in yesterday's big haul. The two men who were in the car at the time escaped into the woods when they saw the police on their trail, leaving their car standing. One of the men attempted to burn the machine and flames were already beginning to leap up when the police arrived on the spot.

### Smothered Flames

One of the officers put his coat over the flame and smothered it, luckily in the nick of time. The car with its cargo of alcohol was brought into the city after a vain search was made for the men who

## SHIPMENT OF APPLES GOING ON STEADILY

**Expectations Are That  
Apple Shipping Will  
Be Done by End of  
Month — McIntosh  
Apple a Favorite.**

By the end of the present month the shipment of New Brunswick apples to other parts of Canada will be about completed and the prices obtained for these apples is as much as was expected. Early in the season it was feared that the crop this year would be greatly below the 1927 average but an estimation made recently reveals that the situation has immeasurably improved with the yield of younger trees later in the season.

Montreal has been the port to which the majority of New Brunswick crops have been shipped and the prices obtained have been very good. This thriving Quebec port has secured the major yield of provincial apples and have been buying the McIntosh Red, Alexander and other varieties in large quantities. The McIntosh, particularly seems to appeal to the Montreal shippers.

A G. Turney, provincial horticulturist estimates that this apple is having
