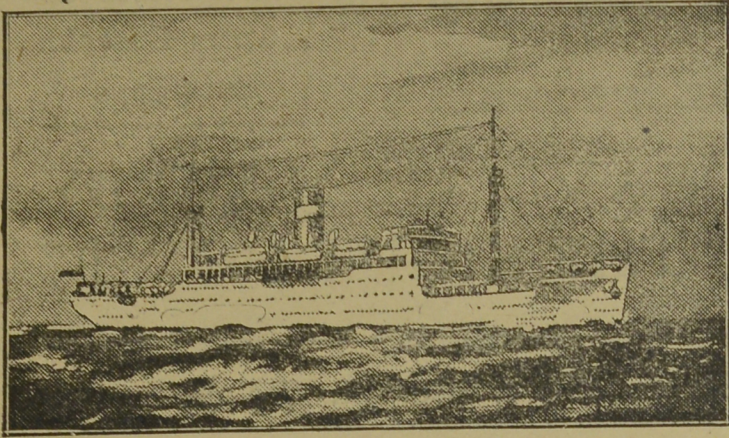


LADY NELSON FIRST OF NEW FLEET



Five well-designed, well-conditioned steamers are under construction for the Canadian National Steamships for services between Canadian Atlantic ports, the West Indies and British Guiana, and Bermuda, the Bahamas and Jamaica. The first of these vessels will be known as the "Lady Nelson" and will be ready to inaugurate the service at the close of this year. These steamers will engage in the passenger, cargo and mail service, offering superior accommodation for tourists and travelers and ample provision for the carriage of general freight and refrigerator goods.

The steamers will be 438 feet over all, 59 feet 3 inches extreme breadth, maximum draught 24 feet, gross tonnage 7650 tons and a service speed of 14 knots. They will be operated by the Canadian National Steamships in connection with the trade agreement made by the Canadian Government and the Governments of the Islands. The hulls will be painted white, with red boot topping, and the funnel in three bands of red, white and blue.

ELLSWORTH WOULD SET OUT TO THE RESCUE OF AMUNDSEN

New York July 25—Believing it to be worthwhile he made one final effort to determine the fate of Roald Amundsen, who has been lost since he flew from Spitzbergen in an effort to rescue General Umberto Nobile and other stricken members of the crew of the ill-fated Italia, Lincoln Ellsworth, backer and co-leader of the Amundsen-Ellsworth Arctic expedition of 1926 yesterday offered his services to head such a final effort.

Mr. Ellsworth has arranged his personal affairs so that he may leave this country at a moment's notice. His offer of services he cabled to Lauritus Swenson, American minister, at Oslo, Norway, who is in direct touch with the relief work now being carried on. In his cable Mr. Ellsworth has left open the final decision of whether or not such a last effort as suggested could be undertaken, through his associates the Arctic explorer has made it clear that he is prepared to "spend thousands of dollars" if the slightest advantage is to be gained from such an effort.

Mr. Ellsworth's proposition is to use a Dornier-Wal plane, and to fly where a search could be started from from Bergen, Norway, to Tromso the air of the area to the north where Amundsen is believed to have been forced down.

Mr. Ellsworth's offer of services

were made in the following cable. Minister Swenson American Embassy, Oslo, Norway.

If you approve would like Dornier-Wal meet me Bergen fly Tromso thence search appropriate northern area for Amundsen. Please inquire cost, availability of plane, pilot, if plans meets your approval.

LINCOLN ELLSWORTH.

Mr. Ellsworth when seen at the Metropolitan Club yesterday declined to elaborate on his offer or services or give further details, saying that his cable message was self-explanatory.

Other inquiries he referred to Commander Fitzhugh Green, U.S.N., retired.

Close Friends

"Mr. Amundsen and Ellsworth were close friends and naturally he wishes to have no doubt that everything possible for his rescue was done," said Commander Green. "He is ready to leave at a moment's notice to head this new expedition.

It was recalled that when Nobile was first lost that Mr. Ellsworth cabled abroad offering his services. At that time the nature of his offer was mistaken and it was reported in London that Mr. Ellsworth was prepared to finance heavily a large relief expedition.

A QUICK CHERRY CAKE

- 1 cup flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1-4 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup milk
- 2 cups pitted cherries
- 1 egg
- 1 tablespoon melted butter

Sift the flour, baking powder salt and sugar into bowl, add the milk melted butter and well beaten egg; mix well and add the cherries. Pour into deep pie tin which has been brushed with butter. Bake in hot oven twenty five minutes; serve warm. Melt the butter in the pie tin before adding to the mixture. It greases the plate for the cake.

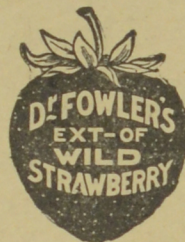


OLD FASHIONED STEAMED CHERRY PUDDING

- 1 1-2 cups flour
 - 1 1-2 teaspoons baking powder
 - 1-2 teaspoon salt
 - 3-4 cup milk
 - 2 eggs (well beaten)
 - 2 cups pitted cherries
 - 1 cup sugar
- Sift the flour, baking powder and salt into bowl, add the milk and well beaten eggs; then the pitted pie cherries and sugar; mix well. Brush small kettle or mold with butter, put in the pudding and steam 2 1-2 hours. Serve with any sauce desired or with chopped and sugared cherries.
