

BODY OF GEORGE BUCHANAN FOUND NEAR DOUGLAS

Remains Well Preserved When Located Early Last Evening Opposite Scene of Accident—Funeral at Sussex.

The body of George Buchanan, 23 year old farmer, who was drowned on Saturday night, when the canoe in which he and three companions were crossing from Sugar Island to the mainland turned over, was recovered last night at about seven o'clock. The body in a well preserved condition was found by searchers, floating upward in the dead water at Douglas, nearly opposite the scene of the fatal accident. Efforts to retrieve the body have been carried on since Saturday night when news of the accident was first learned.

For the past two days grappling irons were put into use and a number of men have been feverishly engaged in the search for the body of the unfortunate man.

Canoe Upset

The accident, the second in this locality this summer, occurred on Saturday evening near Springhill. The deceased in company with Elmer Buchanan, Jake Elliot, and David McKay were crossing in a canoe from Sugar Island to the mainland on this side of the St. John river. The four had been engaged during the day haying on Sugar Island and were returning at nightfall to their homes at Kingsclear. Unluckily the canoe came in contact with a salmon weir and was quickly upset. Three of the occupants clutched at the sides of the canoe; but young Buchanan disappeared before any help could be given him. The news was quickly spread and the search for the drowned man began, lasting up until last night.

Was a Farmer.

Deceased was formerly of Sussex and moved here several years ago. He

LOCAL OFFICERS TO AID IN SEARCH OF MISSING GIRL

Ethel Belyea, 30, Disappears From Home at Glenwood—So Far Efforts to Find Her are Fruitless.

Acting on word received from St. John relative to the disappearance of Miss Ethel Belyea, aged 30 years on Sunday evening from her home at Glenwood, the local headquarters of the Provincial Police have detached officers Bird and Vail to that section to aid in the search for the missing girl. A report received from the searchers this morning from St. John revealed no clues as to her whereabouts, though it is understood that Miss Belyea, who is the daughter of the late H. B. Belyea of St. John, left home on Sunday with the intention of visiting nearby neighbors. Diligent search is being made today in the region near the young lady's home in the hope of clearing up her mysterious disappearance.
