DRIVE FOR FUNDS BY BOY SCOUTS IN THIS CITY

Sum of \$2,500 Required by Boy Scout Association — Canvassing to Raise Sum — Camp Erected.

The Boy Scout Association of this district is in the midst of a publicity campaign and drive to raise the sum of \$2,500 which will go toward the upkeep of Boy Scout activities in this city and Devon. One of the chief reasons of the drive is to keep the services of W. V. B. Riddell, who is district scoutmaster and physical instructor in the schools of the city. Another reason is larger organization purposes. It is thought that with the growth of the Scout organization many more boys would join and thus help to make the Association a greater success than ever before.

In connection with this movement for funds, the Boy Scouts have erected a model camp on the grounds of the Provincial Normal School. This camp represents the Patrol camp—a patrol being the smallest unit of the Boy Scout organization—consisting of
