

MRS. G. E. GEORGE RECEIVES WORD OF FATHER'S DEATH

News Came by Letter
Saturday Afternoon 8
Days After Death—
Died in Mexico Hospi-
tal.

News of the death in Mexico of N. I. Zaher, father of Mrs. George E. George who came to this country in the spring of 1927 as the wife of Geo. E. George local drygoods store proprietor, was received on Saturday at two o'clock by his daughter in this city. The letter stated that Mr. Zaher had passed away at the Chihuahua hospital, Mexico, on the 25th day of September, death being due to typhoid fever. The deceased who is a resident of Esmeraldo, Coah, in Mexico, was taken sick at his home and following a short period in the local hospital was removed to the larger one in Chihuahua. All efforts to save his life however proved unavailing and he passed away on the 25th day of the preceding month.

Died Sept. 25th.

Word of Mr. Zaher's death was not known here until about 14 days after his burial. This was of course due to the time taken for a letter to come from Mexico, while his eight days. Mrs. George who is one of five daughters is greatly grieved over the sad news. Besides Mrs. George of this city, who is a daughter, deceased is survived by his wife and four other daughters, and one son. He was 43 years of age and was well known throughout the locality in which he lived. Mr. and Mrs. George are receiving the sympathy of their friends in this city over their bereavement.

Midweek Market

The spell of wet weather which prevailed this morning for about half an hour did not scatter the farmers who had come in for the midweek market at Phoenix Square and there were a quite a large number of teams present. Produce was plentiful with apples being the chief seller. The price of apples was \$2 per barrel. Potatoes also were on hand and were bought for \$1.50 per barrel. Butter and eggs again were high and sold for 45 cents and 50 cents respectively. Other prices were as follows: veal 12 to 19 cents lb; Lamb, 20 and 28 cents; squash 3 cents per pound; pumpkin 2 cents per pound; tomatoes (green) 25 cents per peck; fowl 30 cents per pound; carrots 5 cents per bunch; beets 5 cents per bunch; cabbage 10 cents a piece.

THE ATTORNEY GENERAL WILL OPPOSE APPEAL

The Doherty Liquor
Case, Appealed to the
Supreme Court of Can-
ada, to be Argued at
Ottawa Monday.

The case of Coun. John F. Doherty of Springhill recently convicted of violating the Intoxicating Liquor Act and fined \$500 and six months in jail, has been appealed directly to the Supreme Court of Canada and will be argued on Monday of next week. Mr. J. J. F. Winslow, K. C., counsel for the defence will apply for habeas corpus on the ground that the Canada Temperance Act is still in force in the County of York. Mr. Winslow plans to leave for the Federal capital tomorrow afternoon. Hon. J. B. M. Baxter, K. C., Attorney General will proceed to Ottawa tomorrow to oppose the application.

It will be recalled that the operation of the Canada Temperance Act was suspended during the war following the enactment of prohibitory legislation in this and other provinces. In September last a stated case was argued before the N. B. Supreme

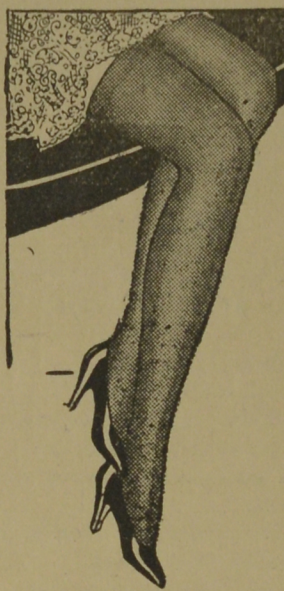
