## TWO CANADIAN PROVINCES ARE IN \$25,000 DERBY

Page Dairy Pacing Stake Draws All—Toledo, July 9-14 — Sir Roch is Entered.

Toledo, O., Feb. 29—Sixteen states and two Canadian provinces are represented in the list of 51 entries to the \$25,000 Page Dairy Pacing Stake to be contested at the second Grand Circuit meeting here, July 9-14.

Ohio leads with 12 eligibles. New York is second with seven. Kentucky, Indiana, and Ontario, Canada are tied for third with four each. Then follow Missouri 3; Colorado, Georgia, North Carolina, Wisconsin and Connecticut 2 and Michigan, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, Illinois, Kansas, Tennessee and Manitoba, Canada, 1.

Most notable among the entries are a pair of two-minute pacers, Sir Roch, the property of L. E. Randall, of Chicago, and Highland Scott, owned by the New York sportsman, E. Roland Hariman. Sir Roch jointly holds the world record of 1.59 1/2 for geldings with Frank Bogash, Jr. Highland Scott is the only pacer that has beaten two minutes as a three-year-old, traveling in 1.59 1/2 against time.

The \$12,500 Hotel Secor trot and the \$7,500 Hotel Commodore Perry trot, other stake features for the meet, drew respective entries of 39 and 34.

## HOOF PRINTS

Cleveland, O., Feb. 28—The North Randall race track, a member of the Grand Circuit since 1908, will give six trotting and pacing stakes at its meeting, July 2-7. The historic fixtures, The Ohio 2.08 trot, The Lavern "Steak" which has been changed from a 2.12 to a 2.20 trot and The Edwards 2.08 pace, again are on the program. Each will have a purse value of \$2,000. Other races are the \$2,000 Fasig three-year-old 2.12 trot; the \$1,500 Sportsman three-year-old 2.10 pace and the Trotting Horse Club of America for free-for-all trotters. Entries close Monday, March 12. American Trotting Association eligibility will govern.

Hanover, Pa., Feb. 28—Guy McKinney, holder of the four-year-old trotting record of 1.58 1/2 and the fastest living trotting stallion, has entered the ranks of progenitors. His first foal recently arrived at the Hanover Shoe Farms here. It is a bay filly out of the Peter the Great mare. The Purple Lady. Another recent arrival is a bay colt by Peter the Brewer, 2.02 1/2 Ruby Hall, 2.04 1/2.

Goshen, N. Y., Feb. 28—Entries to the stakes to be contested at the Grand Circuit speed festival here, Aug. 20-25, close Thursday, March 1. The events are the Good Time two-year-old trot, estimated value \$20,000; the \$10,000 Goshen Inn 2.08 trot; \$3,000 The Burgoyne 2.12 trot; \$3,000 The Bradley 2.12 three-year-old trot; \$2,000 The President 2.16 trot; \$2,000 The Bradford 2.19 trot; \$1,000 added Trotting Horse Club of America; \$10,000 Board of Trade 2.07 pace; \$3,000 The Trainer 2.12 pace; \$2,000 The Princeton 2.03 pace; \$2,000 The Independent Republican Pace and the \$2,000 Down East three-year-old pace.

### Aldridge Hold Out.

Hot Springs, Ark., Feb. 26—John McGraw has written the riot act to Viv Aldridge, Giant holdout, the New York manager announced last night.

In an ultimatum to the ex-Pirate pitcher, which McGraw said he has written, Aldridge was told he could accept or reject the club's proposal and that the club would hold no further negotiations with him.

Aldridge, who was traded to the Giants for Burleigh Grimes, has been offered \$1,000 more than he received with Pittsburgh, McGraw said.

Aldridge is at his home in Terre Haute, Ind., and has consistently refused to report for preliminary training.

McGraw said he wasn't worried about Jess Doyle, another holdout. Doyle wants more money, too, but will have to prove his worth, the manager said. Doyle was obtained from Toronto.

### Pirates At It.

Paso Robles, Calif., Feb. 29—The Pittsburgh Pirates took a day off from training duties today and deserted the camp for hikes and trips over the countryside.

Paul and Lloyd Waner arrived today, having concluded their vaudeville engagements yesterday. Both are great boosters for a cousin, Travis Waner, who is coming Tuesday for a tryout.

The brothers insist Travis is the best batter in the Waner family.

### BIG NOISES

Atlanta, Feb. 28—Baseball's major league training camps were increased to 10 today with the arrival of three additional entourages, while those already on the grounds enjoyed the first day of idleness.

Jack Hendricks and his Cincinnati Reds reached Orlando during the day, while Babe Ruth, Lou Gehrig and the rest of the New York Yankee sluggers reached St. Petersburg, and Wilbert Robinson's Brooklyn Dodgers pitched camp at Clearwater.

Danny Clark and Dan Hunt reached Avon Park in time to join the other Cardinals in celebrating Grover Alexander's 41st birthday anniversary.

One of Robinson's first tasks after arriving at Clearwater was to consult with Dazzy Vance, one of his hurling staff, who is reported holding out for \$20,000 a year. Vance, who has been at Clearwater for some weeks getting into condition, recently reported that he was holding out for a salary advance, but declined to name the figure.

Hendricks announced his team would begin training in earnest tomorrow.

While these three camps were being established the St. Louis Browns at Palm Beach, the Washington club at Tampa, the Athletics at Fort Myers, the Philadelphia Nationals at Winterhaven and the Cardinals at Avon Park were loafing in preparation for more strenuous work the coming week.

## THINKS LABOR WILL WIN THE NEXT ELECTION

London, Feb. 27—"The tide of public opinion continues to roll against the government in constituencies which favored the Tory party. Its candidates are losing their foothold and although they may secure election they cannot in any instance obtain a majority of the votes cast," declared Rt. Hon. J. R. Clynes, one of the leaders of the Labor party at a Labor meeting at Wednesday, Staffordshire today.

The speaker added that the government was "governing without confidence." If the Labor party could gain at the general election in the degree of its advance in by elections and the government lose in the same measure they might face the next appeal to the country with the confidence of a Labor triumph he said.

## AROOSTOOK SPUD MARKET IS STRONGER

Presque Isle, Me., Feb. 27—The Aroostook potato market opened strong today at the top figure of the season, \$3.50 a barrel, but growers are not yet ready to open up the reserve stock, now estimated at around 9,000 carloads in the county, and are waiting for higher prices. The offerings today were in the usual scattering wagon lots and the market demand was moderate. Shipments from storage today were about 200 carloads and weather slightly more favorable than for the last two days.

Avon Park, Fla., Feb. 29—While major league players in other Florida training camps halted their preparations for the season in observation of the Sabbath today, the St. Louis Cardinals observed a momentous occasion, the 41st birthday anniversary of Grover Cleveland Alexander.

"Old Pete" who shares with Jack Quinn of the Athletics the honor of being the oldest hurler in the major leagues, is beginning his 17th campaign in the big-time and his mates gave him rousing acclaim today.

Concrete expressions of good will in neatly-tied packages surrounded Alex's plate when he sat down for breakfast but his grin widened as he received hearty claps on the back and warm clasps of hands of teammates and friends as they wished him a successful season.

## COST OF PETROL FOR LONG TRIP WAS NOT HEAVY



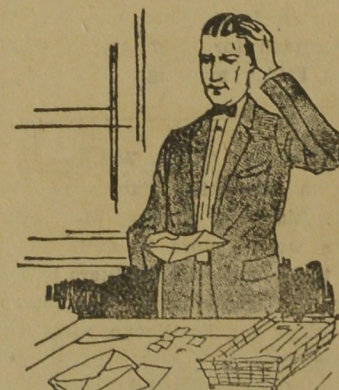
