

THREE MONTHS
JAIL SENTENCE
FOR HOWLAND

North Devon Man is
Jailed for Breaking
and Entering a Store
on University Avenue
in This City.

Bruce Howland of North Devon, who was arrested by the city police some days ago for breaking and entering the grocery store of C. C. Woods on University Avenue, appeared before Police Magistrate Limerick at the police court this morning. He was sentenced to three months in the York County jail.

On the night of December 11th Howland, it is charged, entered the store of Mr. Woods and stole a set of pipes and a watch. The evidence of four witnesses all for the crown was heard. The witnesses heard were Mr. Woods, proprietor of the store, John Gregory, jeweller who identified the watch as one which he had repaired some time ago, Percy Banks who was employed in a store at Devon where the accused attempted to sell the pipes and where they were later found by the police. The police found the watch on the accused at Devon. Two men who were subsequently arrested and held as material witnesses were let go. Chief Jones of the local police force appeared for the crown and C. R. Hawkins for the defence.

SHOTS FIRED IN
A RUM SEIZURE
AT ST. HILAIRE

Touring Car Containing
Contraband Liquor
Seized Last Night by
Customs Officers and
Provincial Police.

The Provincial Police at St. Hilaire, Madawaska County, were under fire last night as a result of a rum seizure at that place. Customs officer Baughard of St. Hilaire accompanied by members of the Provincial Police seized a large touring car containing nine bags of smuggled booze valued at five hundred dollars. The smugglers escaped to the woods and fired on the officers who returned the shots and gave chase but the smugglers who were evidently acquainted with the locality made their getaway. The car and contents were taken possession of by the officers.

Sergeant Smith of the Provincial Police detachment at Edmundston seized a quantity of alcohol in a car driven by Fred. Levesque of St. Jacques. The seized goods were taken to St. Jacques this morning and is now in the possession of the Provincial Police.

PLENTIFUL IN
THE MARKET

Price a Little Higher
Than in Some of the
Stores—Produce Laden
Teams Began Arriving Early.

The Christmas market today was unusually large, teams and cars taking up four sides of Phoenix Square and extending down Queen Street for some distance. Some of the farmers at the market arrived in the city as early as five and six o'clock in the morning. A large quantity of Christmas poultry was offered for sale. The prevailing prices for poultry were somewhat lower than earlier in the week. Although many citizens felt the cold somewhat this morning after the continued mild winter weather, the temperature did not go as low as one would think. The official report from the Dominion Experimental Station this morning showed that the maximum temperature for the past twenty-four hours was twenty-four above and the minimum was three above. A strong wind which prevailed made the cold seem more intense.


