FUR PRICES DECLINE AT AUCTION SALE

Montreal, April 2—No advance in the quotations on furs as compared with the February prices was recorded at yesterday's session of the spring sales of the Canadian Fur Auction Sales Company, Limited, held in the Mount Royal Hotel. Prices for blue fox, kolinsky, mole and bear remained unchanged, but several instances of a decline in price were noted in other furs.

At the opening of the spring sale yesterday, 12 different kinds of fur came under the hammer of F. H. Pingree, general manager of the company. Sixteen blue fox pelts were offered, with prices ranging from \$9 to \$71. Kolinsky achieved \$5.30 as the top price, 2,915 pelts being put up, while quotations on mole, with 64,000 skins, ranged from eight cents to 15 cents. Bear pelts to the number of 90 were offered, the maximum price reached being \$9. Red fox declined 10 per cent, 2,540 skins being offered with \$51 the highest price.

There were 761 skins of white fox, the prices of which showed a decline of 5 per cent. Russian squirrel also showed a decline of 10 per cent, the highest quotations in a lot of 11,600 being \$1.30. Fisher declined 20 per cent. The large skins were neglected and the highest quotation on the extra dark pelts was \$180. Australian opossum, numbering 800 brought \$2.60 each, and figures on chinchilla ranged from 10 cents to \$1.60. For extra large Western ermine the top price was \$3.75, but this fur, offered in a lot of 29,850 remained on the whole unchanged as compared with the winter sale.

LITTLE BOY AT HALIFAX WAS KILLED

Halifax, N. S., April 1—Jackie Carroll, five-year-old son of Staff Sergeant Edward Carroll of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, was crushed to death today under a heavy piece of slate which he evidently dislodged from its position against a wall in one of the barrack corridors. He was found dead by an older sister after being missing for two hours.

(Continued From Page Eight.) to the outbreak of the Great War and later in the year was wrecked near the Cuban Coast.

Shipwrecked Four Times.

Capt. Read during his long career at sea was shipwrecked four times and on one occasion had the thrilling experience of being hauled ashore on a breeches buoy. His vessel was wrecked in a wild storm off the New Jersey Coast and according to the law at sea he was supposed to be the last man to leave her. On account of his weight, however, the mate refused to leave him and they exchanged places with the result that both got ashore in safety.

Active During War.

Capt. Read has made many voyages across the Atlantic making the trip on one occasion in a ninety ton schooner. For many years he was engaged in the South American and West Indies trade. In 1916 while the Great War was in progress he crossed the Atlantic to the Cape Verde Islands in a tern schooner. During the summer of 1918 he sailed from St. John on the lumber laden schooner Silver Leaf for the East Coast of Africa. When off the Coast of Brazil the schooner sprang a leak and after lightening the cargo he put back to Barbadoes and on entering the harbor the schooner ran aground and broke in two. This was his last voyage in command of a ship, but four years ago he accompanied his son, Capt. Eldon H. Read on a voyage by steamer through the Panama Canal and up the Pacific Coast as far as Seattle. It was not his first glimpse of the Pacific Ocean, however, as he had previously made a trip by rail from Fredericton to Victoria, B. C.

Capt. Read was for many years a resident of Hopewell Cape, Albert County, but since the death of his wife fourteen years ago he has made his home here with his daughter, Mrs. R. P. Allen.
