## BRAVES LOSE 2-1 GAME TO ROBINS

Miami, Fla., April 1—The Robins made it two straight from the Braves by winning today's game 2 to 1.

The Braves were somewhat weakened through the absence from the game of Eddie Moore, who is under observation at his hotel and may be developing a case of appendicitis. The examination showed symptoms but the physician did not believe that it was an acute case or that an operation would be necessary.

It may be that the trouble is the result of a bad wrench he sustained on the wet playing field yesterday and that a few days rest will straighten things out.

The game today was a battle all the way through. The Braves scored a run in the first inning on a single by Hornsby, a steal and a double by Bell, and this solitary tally kept them in the lead until the fourth, when Hendrick bent his bat on a fast one grooved up by Goldsmith and sent the ball sailing between center and right fields for a home run.

## YANKS WIN ONE OUT OF 10 GAMES

St. Petersburg, Fla., April 1—The Yankees lost their ninth exhibition game in 10 starts today, being beaten out by Buffalo 3 to 2. The Yanks got nine hits to seven by the International Leaguers but could not get the runners across the plate.

Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig had one single apiece. Waite Hoyt gave only four hits in the six innings he pitched, but Archie Campbell who followed him, ran into a bad spot at the start and let the winning run in on a walk and two hits. The score:

## HARBOR LOANS FOR ST. JOHN AND HALIFAX

Ottawa, March 30—Loans of \$5,000,000 to the Saint John Harbor Board, and \$500,000 to the Halifax Harbor Board, are proposed by the Federal Government. These advances are for the purpose of constructing such terminal facilities as are necessary to properly equip both ports.

The proposed loans are the first to be made to the New Board of Harbor Commissioners, recently appointed at Saint John, N. B., and Halifax, in accordance with recommendations contained in the Duncan report on Maritime rights. Detailed plans, specifications and estimates for these works, in addition to the deposit of debentures of the boards to cover the advances will be subject to the approval of the Governor-in-Council.

## SECTION FINALS END IN TIES

Rangers 1; Bruins 1  
Madison Square Garden, New York, April 1—Sixty minutes of torrid hockey between the Boston Bruins and the New York Rangers ended in a 1-1 deadlock here tonight, and the teams will travel to Boston for the second game of the final series for the championship of the American team to meet the Canadian group titleholders for the world's professional hockey championship.

Maroons 2; Canadiens 2.  
Montreal, April 1—Canadiens and Maroons, Montreal's entries in the N. H. L., last night battled to a two-goal draw in the first contest of the two game play off series between the two teams to decide which club will represent the Canadian section of the league in the Stanley Cup series against the winners of the American division. It was a grueling but brilliantly fought struggle in which penalties played an important part. Twenty-two infractions were called by the officials including two majors, one each to Ledue and Phillips for attempting to start a minor brawl in the third period.

## TUNNEY WILL GO TO SPAIN

Madrid, April 1—Gene Tunney, heavyweight champion, is coming to Barcelona in 1929 to fight Paulino Uzcudun, Spanish heavyweight champion, Senior Regio, royal commissioner to the Barcelona Exposition which will take place next year, announced today.

Regio declared that Tunney will battle Paulino before 65,000 spectators at a stadium to be built for the contest and that tickets of admission will be at an average of \$2.

Tunney in a statement from Miami Beach, Fla., yesterday said he had accepted an invitation from King Alfonso to give an exhibition before the Spanish sovereign at the Barcelona Exposition in 1929. The champion did not mention anything in the nature of a title bout while in Europe.




