Ruth and Gehrig Feature Win With Circuit Drives—Red Sox Jump Into Fourth Place—Uhle Again Stars in Box and at Bat—Cubs on Top By Virtue of 11th Straight Win in National.

New York, May 17—The Yankees ran their winning streak to seven straight here today by winning the first of four engagements with the St. Louis Browns 4 to 3. The game was featured by Ruth's twelfth and Gehrig's sixth home run, but these drives were matched by circuit blows from the bats of Lu Blue and Otis Brannan.

After the home run battle had ended in a draw, Crowder relieved Harold Wilso with the bases filled in the ninth and forced the winning run home by walking Combs after Durst had struck out. Stapley Coveleskie went the route for the Yanks for the first time this year.

## HORSE COLONY READY FOR MIAMI TRACK MEET

Toledo, May 17—The training colony preparing for the opening of the Grand Circuit season at the Ft. Miami track here, June 25, has been enlarged with the arrival of Bl Shively from Winfield, Kas. and Jeff Cunningham from Macon, Ga., Shively brought nine head and Cunningham twelve.

In the Shively lot are the two fast pacers, Red Herr 2.03 1/4 and Alwood, candidates for the \$25,500 Page Dairy. Others in the strong are the pacers, Donna Cupid, 2.07 1/4, an eligible to the \$25,000 American Derby at Kalamazoo, Mich.; Olive Russell 2.10 1/4, and Mac Belwin, 2.10 1/4; the trotters, Toins Boy, 2.06 1/4, and Betty Ann Maxey, 2.09 1/4, and three colts.

As the result of a conference between members of the Sheep Breeders' Association, financial representatives and members of the Winnipeg and Brandon Boards of Trade, a movement is under way for the placing of 100,000 sheep annually on Manitoba farms.
