## VICKERS AND SUN LIFE OPEN RUGBY SEASON

Montreal, Sept. 26—The English rugby season was away to a good start on Saturday afternoon with Vickers and Sun Life playing a 3-all drawn game at Gymbourg Park. Both teams had regulars missing from their line-ups, Vickers being without Alden at three-quarter and Vassie at forward, while Sun Life were without Hill and Evans, both halves and Murdoch at three-quarter. The match was a first round Lyman Cup encounter.

Neither side played too brilliantly in either half, play at times being loose due to overkeenness on the part of the majority of the players of both sides. Sun Life were the first to break into the scoring column when Dudgeon kicked a penalty goal, Vickers being penalized for not playing the ball. Near the end of the half Vickers started a promising movement but the play ended with King being forced into touch near the Sun Life line.

A few minutes after play was resumed Vickers heeled from a scrum well in their own half and after Leeds Hurst and Stein had handled the ball Fairweather on the wing, completed a 50 yard run by scoring. Johnson failed with the kick. Both sides played up in this half but with very little success. Sun Life on two occasions lost possession of the ball when in a scoring position.

## THE POLICE OF CHICAGO MAKE GIANT ROUND UP

Chicago, Ills., Sept. 25—A series of week-end raids that snared 25 men and two women, was being pointed out today as one of the greatest single blows at Chicago crime in recent months. More than 100 crimes have been solved as result of the arrests, Deputy Commissioner Stege said.

There were three raids, personally conducted by the Deputy Commissioner. Among crimes in which the commissioner said he had confessions, were: The slaying of Maurice Younglove, a private watchman, during a holdup September 8.

The shooting and serious wounding of two policemen and the slaying of John Pecora at the Turkish Village Cafe, September 21.

The daylight holdup of the Davis Hotel, September 9.

The \$6,870 payroll robbery of the Herald-Examiner, July 28.

The attempted payroll robbery at the Chicago Tribune, July 30.

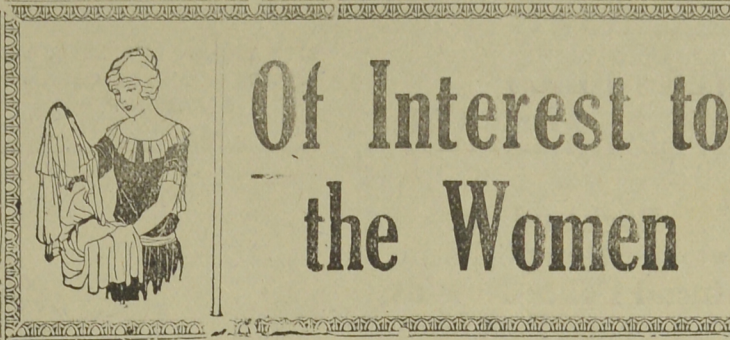
Police said that most of their prisoners were members of one big gang that practised crime in all its branches.

### RAISIN PUFFS

1-4 cup butter  
1-2 cup sugar  
1 egg, beaten  
1-2 cup milk  
1-1 2 cups flour  
3 teaspoons baking powder  
1 cup seeded and chopped raisins  
(Cream butter and sugar with egg. Add alternately with milk and flour mixed with baking powder. Fill greased cups half full and steam one hour. Serve with whipped cream.)

## Of Interest to the Women

### CATSUP

1 peck ripe tomatoes  
1 quart vinegar  
1-2 tablespoon red pepper  
1 tablespoon black pepper  
1 tablespoon ground mustard  
1 tablespoon cloves, cinnamon and allspice  
2 tablespoons salt  
1-2 cup sugar  
Cut tomatoes and cook until soft; strain through sieve. Add other ingredients boil until thick and bottle while hot.

### CHILI SAUCE

1-1 2 dozen ripe tomatoes  
3 small onions  
3 green peppers  
1 cup sugar  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
1-2 teaspoon chili powder  
1 teaspoon powdered cloves  
2 cups vinegar  
1-2 teaspoon ginger  
1 tablespoon salt  
Remove the skins of tomatoes, peel the onions and discard the pepper seeds. Put the vegetables in a kettle after chopping them in small pieces. Cook slowly until they are tender. Add sugar, spices, salt and vinegar. Cool 10 minutes and seal in sterilized bottles.

### WHITE LAYER CAKE

3 pounds sugar  
1-1 2 pounds shortening  
1-1 2 pints egg whites  
1-2 ounce salt  
2-1 2 pints milk  
4 pounds flour  
3 ounces baking powder  
1-2 ounce vanilla  
Cream the sugar and shortening add half a pint of egg whites, then whip the balance of the egg whites to a stiff meringue, and add. Mix in the milk and flavor. Sift the baking powder with the flour and add. Bake at about 350 deg. Fah.  
To make a smaller sized cake use half of the proportions named above.

### LIGHT DATE BREAD

1 package dates  
1-1 2 cups boiling water  
1-1 4 cups sugar  
2-3 4 cups bread flour  
1 cup walnut meats chopped  
1 egg  
1 tablespoon butter  
1 teaspoon soda  
1 teaspoon salt

### 1 teaspoon vanilla

Stone the dates and pour the boiling water over them. Add sugar and butter and cool. Add beaten egg; then flour, soda and salt sifted together. Last add nut meats and vanilla. Bake one hour at 350 degrees. this makes one loaf.

### DARK DATE BREAD

Here is the recipe for dark date bread without molasses or yeast requested last week and another for light date bread which sounds too good to miss printing even though it is not exactly what our friend asked for.

1 cup dates  
2-3 cup brown sugar  
2 cups entire wheat flour  
1 cup milk  
4 tsp. baking powder  
1-2 tsp. salt  
2 tbsps. melted shortening.  
Rinse dates under hot water, cut in pieces and place in mixing bowl with brown sugar and milk. Let stand until all lumps in sugar are dissolved. Sift flour with baking powder and salt, add to liquid with shortening and beat well. Pour in greased bread pan, let stand 30 minutes and bake one hour at 325 degrees.

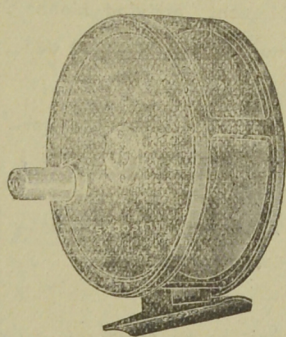
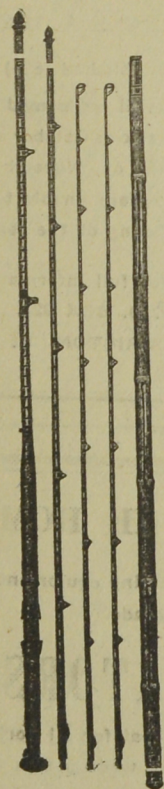

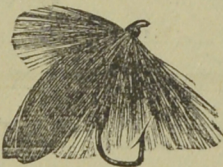

Tenders will not be considered unless submitted on the forms supplied by the Railway Company, and in accordance with the instructions for tendering.

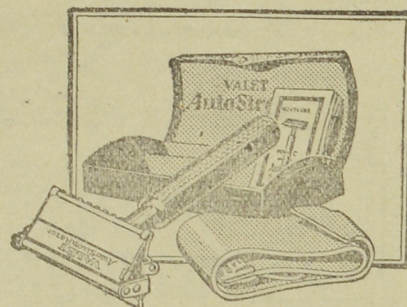
