DEPENDS ON MIXING.

Charlottetown Guardian: Mixed farming pays best in our Province, we are told, but something depends on the mixing. We grow millions of bushels of oats and then buy abroad enough oatmeal, rolled oats and other oaten breakfast foods to eat up the price of all the oats we export. And think of the money we send abroad for mixed pickles, canned tomatoes peas, beans, onions, cucumbers and what not. A million bushels of oats exported would not pay for the canned and bottled fruits and vegetables we import yearly, which ought to be grown and made ready for our tables here at home. This is not sound econ omy nor is it good mixed farming.

Possibly there are parts of the coun try other than Prince Edward Island where the farmers neglect their oppor tunity to supply their tables during the winter season with canned and bottled fruits, vegetables and pickles which would be purer and better than the factory product.
