WHEN HIT BY CAR
AT MARYSVILLE

Florence McKinley, Marysville Young Woman is Now in the Hospital as Result of Accident.

Florence McKinley, 19-year-old daughter of Mrs. Elizabeth McKinley, of Marysville, sustained a painfully fractured leg this morning when she was struck by a car driven by Don Kane, Marysville taxi driver. The accident occurred at about seven o'clock this morning in the alley way between the Marysville hotel and a residence. The young lady was walking across the yard at the time of the accident. When struck, she crumpled down and was unable to rise. She was aided into the hotel and a doctor called. Later she was removed to the Victoria Hospital where she fracture was attended to in the proper manner.

No Blame to Driver.

No blame is attached to the driver of the car for the accident as it was purely accidental. The young lady had evidently become confused when young Kane drove the car into the hotel yard and was dodging back and forth in front of the oncoming machine. As a result the car struck her glancing blow knocking her down and inflicting the aforementioned injuries. Inquiry at the Victoria Hospital this afternoon showed that the victim of the accident is suffering from the shock of the accident. Everything has been done to make the young lady as comfortable as possible under the circumstances.

Of Loyalist Descent.

Mr. W. F. Cronk of Saint John, in a letter to the St. John Telegraph-Journal claims to be the grandson of a United Empire Loyalist and says that two brothers of his grandfather served in the 104th Regiment, which marched to Quebec on snowshoes during the winter of 1813. A printed muster roll of the 104th regiment which was prepared by the late Mr. A. D. Thomas and now adorns a wall in the Mayor's office bears out Mr. Cronk's statement. John Cronk is shown on the list as a corporal and David Cronk as a private. R. A. Stuart of St. Andrews also claims to be the grandson of a Loyalist and Mrs. Louise A. Belyea of Coldstream, Carleton County, claims to be a granddaughter. It might be added here that the late Hon. L. A. Wilmut, New Brunswick's first native born Lieutenant Governor, was the grandson of a Loyalist, and so was the late Sir Richard Cartwright, a noted Ontario statesman.

MR. C.S. BRANNEN
PASSED AWAY
EARLY TODAY

Was Fredericton's Oldest Native Born Citizen — Was For Many Years Employed by the Prov. Government

Mr. Charles Sterling Brannen who had the distinction of being Fredericton's oldest native born citizen passed away at the home of his son Mr. C. S. Brannen, Jr., 148 Argyle street at four o'clock this morning. His death was due to an illness brought on by the infirmities of old age, and although it created no surprise will be deeply regretted by a large circle of old friends. The death of Mr. Brannen removes one of the city's landmarks, as well as the last of the old guard of provincial government officials who functioned before the days of typewriters and bobbed hair, during the closing part of the last century.

The deceased had reached the ripe old age of 91 years and six months and up to quite recently had enjoyed excellent health. He is survived by one son, Mr. C. Sterling Brannen, Jr., of the office staff of the Smith Foundry Company, and one daughter Miss Adelaide Brannen at home. His

CASH SURPLUS OF
\$2,890 SHOWN AT
ANNUAL MEETING

F'ton Exhibition, Ltd. Held Annual Meeting Yesterday with Good Attendance — Past Year Successful.

The Fredericton Exhibition, Limited held their annual meeting yesterday afternoon in the City Council chamber with a good attendance and considerable business done. In the absence of George H. Clark, president, who is at present attending the Associated meeting of Canadian Exhibitions at Toronto, vice president, J. A. Cain occupied the chair very acceptably. Besides the large attendance of the members there was a good attendance of business men who are interested in the success of the Fredericton Exhibition. D. W. Griffiths, acted as secretary at yesterday's meeting.

The auditor's report read by H. G. Hoben was one important item of business. This report showed a total revenue of \$45,351.73 with total expenditure of \$42,461.81, showing a cash surplus for the year's operations of \$2,889.92. Ticket sales for the general exhibition amounted to \$14,144; race track tickets amounted

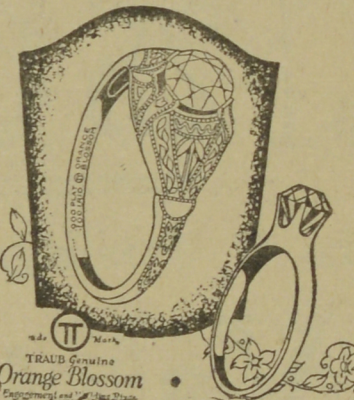
