

DONALD L. SLIPP PASSES AWAY AT THE HOSPITAL

Well Known and Popular Young Man Succumbs to Injuries Sustained in a Car Accident in July, 1926.

After undergoing treatment in the Victoria Public Hospital for the long period of two years and three months for injuries sustained in a motor accident, Donald Logan Slipp, son of Hon. A. R. Slipp was mercifully relieved of his suffering by death at noon today. He took a turn for the worse about three weeks ago and while his sufferings were great at times he bore it all with wonderful fortitude and patience.

The accident which resulted in Mr. Slipp's death today occurred at Burden in the Parish of Prince William in July, 1926. The car in which he was travelling with a party of three other young people went over a steep embankment resulting in serious injuries to Mr. Slipp and to Miss Mooers of Woodstock. The latter succumbed to her injuries a few months later. It was found on examination at the hospital that Mr. Slipp had sustained a fractured vertebrae. Eminent specialists were called in from Boston, Montreal and Toronto at different times only to find that his injuries defied their professional skill. Possessed of a sound constitution and wonderful vitality he put up a splendid fight and certainly deserved to win the victory over death but it was not to be.

A Fine Young Man.

The deceased was in his twenty-fifth year and was a young man of ability and promise. He studied at Rothesay and Picou Academy and in leaving school entered the Royal Bank of Canada with which he remained several years. He spent the winter of 1925-26 in Florida and returned home only a short time before he met with the accident which was the cause of his death. He had a large circle of friends and his sad case has aroused great sympathy throughout the province.

The deceased is survived by his father, a step-mother and two brothers, Hallam L., and Carl R. Slipp of this city.

The funeral will take place from the residence of Judge Slipp, Church street at an hour to be announced later.

NON-RESIDENT SPORTSMEN HAVE SUCCESS

Already a Number of Fine Moose Have Been Secured — Big Game Reported to be Plentiful.

By the same token that "the early bird catches the worm", the early hunters are getting their moose in New Brunswick this season.

Although the open season for moose commenced only yesterday hunters are already coming out of the woods with heads and in some cases carcasses of big bull moose that have fallen before their accurate shots.

One of the best specimens was brought here today by Dr. Gardner, of Lambert Lake, Maine. This moose was shot on the Renous river, a branch of the Miramichi, and had antlers spreading about 50 inches. Another big moose was brought into Fredericton this morning from Tracey Station, having been shot not far from the main line of the Canadian Pacific Railway by a local hunter; it also had antlers with a spread of about 50 inches.

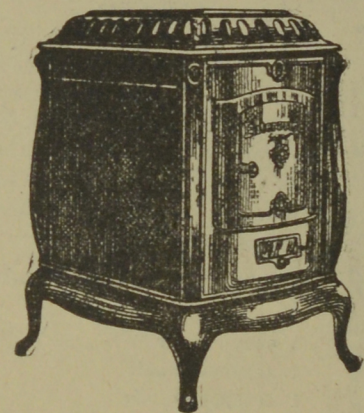
