

CAR DRIVER
HITS BICYCLE
THEN RUNS AWAY

Frank Cadwallader, Resident of University Ave., Struck From Bike by Unknown Autoist.

As the result of an accident last evening in which an unidentified automobile struck the bicycle being driven by Frank Cadwallader, resident of University Avenue. Mr. Cadwallader is today confined to his home suffering with bruises and lacerations about his face and head. The accident occurred on Church street, above the Canadian National railway station and the driver of the car struck Mr. Cadwallader, knocked him from his bicycle and dragged the wheel about fifty feet up Church street, leaving the victim lying in the road in a partially unconscious state.

Never Stopped
The peculiar and unreasonable part of it was that the driver of the car paid no heed to the man lying on the ground but kept on going, never stopping to ascertain the extent of Mr. Cadwallader's injuries. Mr. Cadwallader, who is an employee of James S. Neill's Hardware Store was picked up some time later by a fellow employee and carried to his home which is a short distance from the scene of the accident. A doctor was summoned and the wounds which the victim sustained in his fall promptly dressed.

It was found that Mr. Cadwallader had suffered a number of cuts and scratches about his face and head and these will require careful attention to insure the patient's safe recovery. This morning Mr. Cadwallader was reported to be resting quite comfortably though suffering considerable pain from his injuries.

CONTEST BIRD
HAS PRODUCED
326 EGGS TO DATE

Entire Pen Will be Kept on the Job Until Oct. 31st in Order to Complete the Full Year.

The pen of Barred Rock hens belonging to Mrs. Edward Hart of Newton, Kings County, which won the championship in the 1928 New Brunswick egg laying contest will be kept on the job until October 31st, in order that the leading bird may complete the full year. All previous trap nests records for Canada were based on fifty two weeks and the extension of time has been granted in this case in order that proper comparisons can be made. When the contest closed on Monday Mrs. Hart's bird had 324 eggs and 354.6 points to its credit. Since Monday it has laid two eggs which brings the total up to 326. This has tied the best previous official record made by a British Columbia contest at Agassiz in 1926, except that Mrs. Hart's hen, because of its eggs averaging over two ounces beat out the westerner by over .45 points. The record of 333 eggs held by an Ontario hen was made in an American (Continued on page five.)

CAPE BRETON BOY
JAILED FOR A
BICYCLE THEFT

Two Juveniles Arrested at McAdam With Two Stolen bicycles—Chief Jones Brought Youths in Last Night.

Two Cape Breton youths, Benjamin Stevenson and Richard Smith, both 18 years of age, when arraigned before Police Magistrate Limerick this morning in the city police court on a charge of having stolen two bicycles from this city on Monday of last week pleaded guilty and elected to be tried by the local magistrate, were remanded for sentence. The two boys were arrested yesterday at McAdam by the Canadian Pacific Railway police officials under the direction of the local police and Chief Jones brought the prisoners to this city last night.

Bicycles Recovered
It was learned by the local police that the boys had wheeled to McAdam on the stolen bicycles and the police officials at that place were notified immediately of the thievery.
