The Countess of Ashburnham to Honor Hon. R. B. Bennett and Sister Here on Saturday.

Hon. R. B. Bennett leader of the Conservative party will visit Fredericton on Saturday and the indications are that his visit will be made the occasion of the greatest political demonstration this city has ever seen. It was announced this morning that Hon. Mr. Bennett will be accompanied by his charming sister Miss Mildred Bennett and that they will remain in the city over Sunday going from here to Woodstock by auto on Monday morning.

A Garden Party

The Countess of Ashburnham, who was a delegate to the Winnipeg Convention which elected Hon. Mr. Bennett to the party leadership, will be the hostess at a garden party at five o'clock on Saturday afternoon in honor of the visitors.

Hon. Mr. Bennett will arrive by auto from St. Stephen at twelve o'clock noon on Saturday and will repair to the Palms where he along with the members of the Conservative executive of York-Sunbury will be the guests of Mr. R. B. Hanson K. C., M. P., at luncheon.

The civic reception being arranged in honor of the Conservative leader will begin in the city council chamber at three o'clock. This of course is not a party affair, but is open to all citizens of both sexes who wish to extend a welcome to an illustrious son of New Brunswick who will one day be Premier of Canada.

Public Meeting

The public meeting in the Arctic Rink is scheduled for eight o'clock p. m. It is understood that Mr. W. F. Scott, president of the York Sunbury Conservative Association will occupy the chair. Mr. R. B. Hanson, M. P., will deliver a short address of an introductory nature.

CONVICTIONS IN LIQUOR CASES AT POLICE COURT

Nashwaak Bridge Man Given 30 Day Sentence for Violation — Blackville Man Fined \$200.

Two cases both of a wet nature were settled in the police court yesterday, conviction being made in both by Magistrate Limerick. A term of 30 days in the York County jail was imposed on Chester Urquhart, Nashwaak Bridge man, who was charged with operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of liquor. In the latter case in which three Blackville men are charged with selling liquor and operating a still at Blackville, all three were sentenced to two months in the Northumberland county jail with an additional six months in the event of their not paying the fines which were set at \$200 each. Both cases were contested. The three Blackville men entered pleas of guilty later in the case. The three men were George Gallon, Joseph Curtis and Rhos. Harris.
