

DAIRY CATTLE FROM N. B. TO BE SHOWN AT ROYAL

This Province to be Represented at Big Winter Fair Which Will Open in Toronto Next Week.

New Brunswick will be well represented at the Royal Winter Fair which will open in the Coliseum building on the Exhibition grounds at Toronto on Wednesday of next week. The Department of Agriculture will be represented by Hon. Lewis Smith, the Minister and his deputy Mr. Harvey Mitchell and also by Mr. A. G. Turney horticulturist, and Mr. A. E. McLaurin, the live stock superintendent. Mr. Turney left for Toronto yesterday and Mr. McLaurin plans to leave this evening. Hon. Mr. Smith and Mr. Mitchell will leave here on Tuesday evening of next week.

A number of dairy cattle belonging to New Brunswick breeders will be on exhibition and are expected to give a good account of themselves as was the case last year. A fine exhibit of New Brunswick potatoes will also be shown. The entry list for the Royal Winter Fair is a large one and the show promises to be the most successful ever held in the Dominion. The coliseum where the show is to be held covers about ten acres and is said to be the largest exhibition building in the world.

Probably Aided

Again it is possible that one of these confederates had been on the watch and aided the two in their escape. ST. JOHN CASE WAS FINAL ON APPEAL DOCKET

Wilson vs. Whelpley Action Was Completed Yesterday by Appeal Court—Decision Next Week.

The final case before the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court, the November term of which is in session at the present time, was completed yesterday afternoon after which the court was adjourned until next Friday when two other cases will be finished and judgments given. The last action was from the Chancery Division and is that of Wilson, administrator of the estate of Eliza Anne Marter vs. William P. Marter.

This action is from St. John and has to do with the overpayment of costs entailed in the construction of a house. Whelpley is appealing from the decision of Chief Justice Sir Douglas Hazen. F. R. Taylor, K. C. appeared to support appeal from the decision of the chief justice which was delivered on August 20th. of the present year. This action will be decided next week by Justice Grimmer Crockett and Byrne who will confer on


