## LOVE CUT OUT BY THE MODERN FRENCH WRITERS

Paris, Feb. 7.—Remarking a growing tendency on part of the younger French writers to eliminate love from their novels, or at least to give the "grande passion" an entirely subordinate role, H. Daniel Rops has made a study in an attempt to learn whether or not these writers really represent the ideas of the generation to which they belong. He asks, in other words, whether young France has not abandoned the romantic ideas of their forebears who had exalted love into a religion.

M. Rops agrees that there is much support the idea that wine, woman, and song cannot be considered any longer the ideal of the young Frenchman. His explanation is that the young men who were children when the war started saw too much of vivid reality, too much suffering were thrust too early into the miseries and battles of existence to grow up like their fathers in the times of peace.

"Everything was topsy-turvy," he says, "Boys of 15 were the heads of families because their fathers and elder brothers were on the fighting line. These kids found themselves absolutely independent, and they gave full play to their instincts, all the more because young fellows of 18 were expecting the call to the colors in a couple of years."

Now the fathers of these boys see a generation entirely different from

their own. In the years before the war the Frenchman married at the age of 30 or 40. He had to wait until that age to be in a position to take a wife. Today there are 25 year old leaders of big business affairs, best sellers of 122, wealthy dramatists of 23 fathers of families before 30.

"Before the war," explained M. Rops, "the man who married was established. He had his tastes, habits, inclinations, and his wife had to adapt herself as best she could. Today it is the young man who marries. He looks for a collaboratrice who will follow the same line as he intends to follow."

## Of Interest to the Women

### THE OTHER WOMAN'S WAY.

Four rice boiled potatoes go further than six plain boiled spuds. Sprinkle with salt and pepper, slip in the oven to brown lightly.

Never use German silver for cooking; it is composed of copper, arsenic and nickel. It is oxydized by acids and acts in the stomach as a slow poison.

Until the plumber comes take yellow soap, beat it thick, after warming with whitening rub into the leak and it will be effective.

Tie herbs in bundles put in a paper bag, tie the top and hang the bag in an airy place, blossoms down. When perfectly dry pick off the leaves, pound and sift them and keep the powder in well corked bottles. Parsley for creamed potatoes needs no pounding.

Japanese cement or rice glue is made by mixing rice flour to a smooth paste and boiling very gently. It is made of the consistency of plastic clay and superior in joint transparency and smoothness. It is used to form busts, models and basso-relievos and these articles are susceptible to a very high polish.

Melt one pound of light brown sugar and a five cent cake of maple sugar together with a half pint of water cool and bottle for waffles or pancakes.

### APPLE AND DATE SALAD.

Mix together one and one half cups diced peeled apples (squeezing over the fruit a few drops of lemon juice to keep it from discoloring) half a cup of chopped pitted dates one fourth cup of chopped nut meats one small cup of finely chopped shredded cabbage and two minced canned pimentos. Moisten with mayonnaise dressing and serve in lettuce cups.

### EGYPTIAN CARAMEL CUSTARD.

1-2 cup sugar caramelized  
3 eggs  
2 cups scalded milk  
Few grains salt  
Few grains nutmeg  
1-2 teaspoon vanilla  
1-4 cup sugar  
Carmelize (melt) the sugar over a moderate heat and pour at once into a tin or aluminum mold tipping it until syrup is hardened on the bottom and half-way up the sides. Then beat the eggs add the sugar, salt and flavorings and pour the scalded milk into it. Turn into the lined mold set this into a pan of hot water and bake in a slow oven. Chill and unmold. The syrup will have colored the lower part of the custard the remainder having melted to form a sauce.

2 eggs  
1-4 cup milk

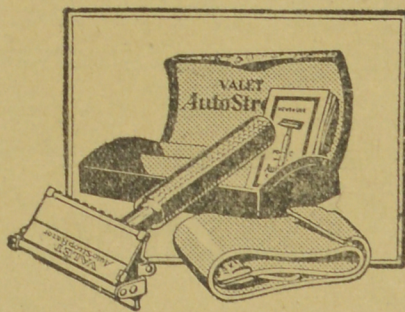
