TOLD OF BAPTIST CONDITIONS IN EUROPE

Rev. Dr. Rushbrooke of London Addressed a Large Audience at the Brunswick St. Baptist Church Last Evening.

In connection with special activities which are being held at the Brunswick Street Baptist church this week pertaining to the dedication of the new hall, Dr. J. H. Rushbrooke D. D., Secretary of the Baptist World Alliance of London, England gave a very interesting address in the Church last evening, taking as his subject "Baptist Conditions in Europe." There was a large audience present to hear Dr. Rushbrooke and all were impressed by his splendid address.

Rev. G. C. Warren presided at the meeting. With him on the platform were Rev. Mr. Mason who offered prayer, Rev. J. A. Corey of Macnaquac who read a brief passage in the scripture and Rev. W. V. Crowell of Fredericton Junction.

At the conclusion of Dr. Rushbrooke's address His Worship Mayor Clark moved a vote of thanks to the speaker for his entertaining and educational effort. W. K. Tibert seconded the motion which was heartily adopted. Dr. Rushbrooke left this morning for Moncton where he will speak in the First Baptist Church this evening. A banquet will be tendered him on his arrival in that city.

VOCATIONAL FREE EVENING CLASSES START

Second Term Began Last Evening With an Enrollment of 115 Students — Ten Subjects to be Taught.

The Fredericton Vocational Committee's free evening classes opened last night for its second term at the High School building with an enrollment of 115 students. The classes this year are approximately the same as last year, with nearly the same number of students enrolled. There are ten subjects and thirteen instructors. The clothing department has three units, a teacher to each unit and the general education department has two units with two instructors. Each of the other eight subjects is under one instructor.

The enrollment this year is slightly smaller than the previous year. The millinery, home nursing and drafting departments are still open as a few more are needed to form a class.

Enrollment by Classes.

Following are the numbers enrolled in each department with the teachers: Bookkeeping, 10, Mr. H. W. McFee; Typing, 17, Miss Marion Ryan; Clothing, Unit I, 10, Miss Cecil Gallagher; Clothing, Unit II, 9, Mrs. Gladys Miller; Clothing, Unit III, 14, Mrs. Eldon McIntosh; Cookery, 12, Miss Isabel Scott; General Education, Unit I, 5, Miss Mildred Haines; General Education, Unit II, 5, Mr. F. E. MacDiarmid; Motor Mechanics, 14, Mr. H. J. Mahwinney; Chemistry, 8, Mr. O. V. B. Miller.

There are three more subjects, millinery, home nursing and drafting, but as mentioned before they are still open for further enrollment.

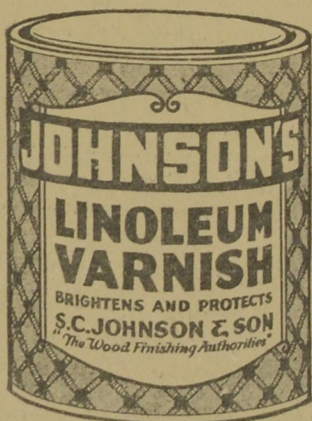
Taken To Hospital.
