

A MONTREAL PAPER PRAISES SIR J. DOUGLAS HAZEN, NEW BRUNSWICK'S CHIEF JUSTICE

(Montreal Standard)

One of the most popular men who ever sat in the House of Commons is Hon. Sir Douglas Hazen, of Saint John, N. B., now chief justice of the Province of New Brunswick, and for six years a member of the Borden Cabinet.

Sir Douglas, who will celebrate his 68th birthday on Tuesday next is in the best sense of the word a public man.

Coming of an old United Empire Loyalist family which has been intimately associated with the history of the province by the sea for the past 150 years, he was practically never divorced from public affairs since that day in 1885 when, as a young lawyer in Fredericton, he became an active member of the city council.

Advanced to High Offices

From that humble beginning he rose to some of the greatest offices in the gift of his own province and the Dominion, but then and later he has been chiefly distinguished for unimpeachable integrity, a personal charm which combines good fellowship with dignity and a thoroughness in every job he tackles, which made him a tower of strength to his party and his country.

Was Mayor at 29

Way back in 1883, Sir Douglas was called to the Bar in Fredericton, and in addition to building up a good practice, he found time to serve in the city council and before he was 29 to hold the office of mayor.

A little later he moved to Saint John, which henceforth became his home, except for his sojourns in Ottawa and frequent trips to the Motherland.

Elected M. P. at 30

Those were fighting days for the Conservative party in the East, and young Hazen on his settlement in Saint John threw himself into the forefront of the battle.

So much so that the year of his arrival saw him chosen as leader of his party in the local House.

Three years later, when little more than 30, he was elected to the Federal Parliament and sat for five years under the several leaderships of MacDonald, Thompson, Abbott and Tupper.

Became Premier of N. B.

In the great Conservative debacle of '96 he went down to defeat, but Hazen did not lose heart or quit the game.

He came back to his own province and once more became a leading figure in the provincial arena.

Twelve years later he again saw the Conservative star in the ascend-

ant and took over the office of premier of the province.

Minister of Marine and Fisheries

When Sir Robert Borden formed his cabinet in 1911 one of his first selections was the strong man from New Brunswick.

Sir Douglas was assigned to the portfolio of marine and fisheries, and under his able administration that department grew in importance and prestige.

Helped Imperial War Cabinet

During the Great War Sir Douglas proved himself the right man in the right place. His cool and deliberate judgment in a time of universal stress and his meticulous attention to duty were invaluable aids to his leader, his countrymen and the Imperial War Cabinet during those dark days when so many great regulations were weighed in the balance and found wanting.

Chief Justice of Province

The popularity that has followed Sir Douglas through his whole life is still in evidence in his occupancy of the high office of chief justice.

"To appear before Sir Douglas is a liberal education in old world courtesy, dignity and kindness," is the opinion of a distinguished colleague, who frequently appears before him.

Cultured Gentleman

Those who enjoy the personal friendship of this eminent Canadian know that this tribute is well deserved.

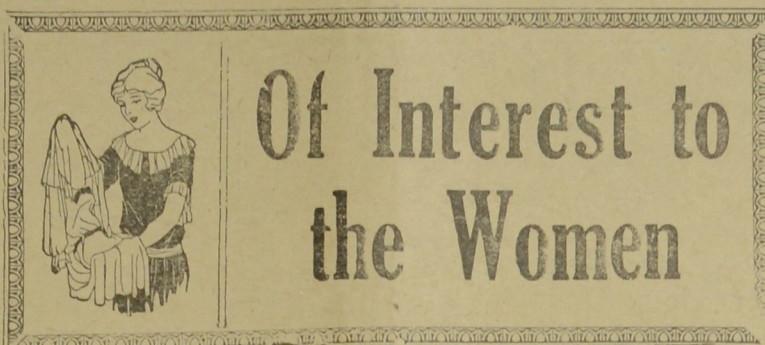
