- 1 teaspoon chopped parsley
- 1 slice onion
- Salt and pepper
- 1-4 cup whipped cream

Make a white sauce of the milk, flour and butter. Scrub the clams thoroughly then open them, wash them in their own liquor and chop them very fine. Strain the liquor through cheescloth and add it to the water. Add the chopped celery onion and parsley and cook ten minutes. Add the chopped clams and cook five minutes longer. 


