#### Twelve Months' Course.

Returning to the subject of Immischools should be established both in Canada and Great Britain to instruct them in agricultural work, at least 12 months being devoted to their education. The bringing of thousands of untrained men to Canada comes very as hundreds of these men become stranded after landing here, particularly those who come to the harvest. "If men must be brought for the harvest," he said, "then arrangements should be made to ship them.

"Co-operative action between the Federal and Provincial Governments, he said, "is the only solution."


