

HOUSEHOLD SUGGESTIONS.

If you roll pie crust or biscuit dough on a big sheet of waxed paper it is less likely to stick and you don't have to wash the board.

Sprouts of onions can be soaked in cold water until crisp and then served like spring onions on the side of a vegetable salad.

If you stick your hands in cold water each time you roll a new popcorn ball they will not stick and you can handle them much hotter.

To make your room gay and to protect the blankets, baste wide bandings of colorful wash goods across the ends nearest your face.

If you wear your stockings out first in any one place put a strip of adhesive tape over your bare foot at that spot to lengthen the life of your hose.

STUFFED CELERY.

Mix with cream cheese, one table spoon cream, dash cayenne and one teaspoon Worcestershire sauce and one half teaspoon salt. Or add to the first three ingredients one third cup chopped salted almonds. Or add to first five ingredients two chopped Spanish pimientos. Fill celery stalks which have been prepared with any of these fillings and sprinkle with paprika.

FRUIT SALAD.

2 grapefruit
Lettuce
1-2 cup small flavored grapes
Cherries
French dressing
Seed grapes. Peel grapefruit, cut into sections. Place on lettuce leaf forming a circle. Fill with grapes. Mix with French dressing. Pass



SARDINE APPETIZERS.

Make a paste of sardines softened butter few drops Worcestershire sauce a little pepper, cayenne, salt and lemon juice. Spread on thin rounds of toasted bread. Cut stuffed olives in rings and put one in center of each appetizer. Place on lettuce leaves and garnish with mayonnaise.

RICE AND PINEAPPLE.

1 cup rice
3 cups cold water
1-2 cup sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup crushed pineapple
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1-2 cup whipped cream
Cook rice with sugar and salt in top of double boiler until soft. Add to whipped cream crushed pineapple and lemon juice. Serve over rice.

Glorified Apple Sauce.

4 cups apples cut in small pieces
1 cup sugar
2 tablespoons water
1 cup cake crumbs
2 tablespoons butter
Wash apples without peeling cut in small pieces. Cook in water until soft and tender; more water may be added if needed to prevent burning. When tender rub through sieve add sugar and beat with dover beater until well mixed. Melt butter and stir the cake crumbs into this and cook one minute. Place apple sauce in serving dish sprinkle with crumbs and dot with whipped cream.

FUDGE ROLL.

One and a half cups granulated sugar, half package (one cup) sliced dates one and a half tablespoons of light syrup half cup of milk half teaspoon butter, half teaspoon vanilla, half cup walnut meats.

Cook the sugar, syrup and milk in a saucepan until boiling point is reached. Continue cooking, stirring occasionally until the candy forms a soft ball when dropped in cold water. Add butter and dates. Let stand until cool. Add vanilla and nut meats. Beat until mixture is the consistency of fudge. Divide into halves. Roll each half on well buttered paper to a thickness of about half an inch and place in a cold place overnight. Cover with paper. Cut in half inch slices. Yield, one pound of candy.

HONORABLES CALLED UPON TO QUIT JOB

Halifax, N. S., Jan. 12.—Armed with the authority furnished him by the decision of the judicial committee of the Privy Council, Premier Rhodes has taken the first steps toward final abolition of the legislative council of Nova Scotia. In a letter sent yesterday to life members of the council, Premier Rhodes requests them to send him their resignations, reminding them of the decision of the Privy Council authorizing the government to appoint additional members sufficient to give a majority to an abolition bill, and also referring to their pledges, given at the time of appointment, to support an abolition bill. Failure to hear from the legislative councillors to whom he had addressed the letters within ten days, would be taken to indicate, Mr. Rhodes said, "that you would prefer that your office should be vacated by order-in-council."

ane establishment of a game sanctuary in western Nova Scotia was announced recently by W. L. Hall, Attorney-General of the Province. The reserve covers an area of approximately 200 square miles and contains fine scenery, majestic rivers and forests and lakes in which trout and wild life are sure to thrive. The new sanctuary will take in the chief waterways of Lake Rossignol, Shelburne River, Jordan, Sixth and Fifth Lakes.

According to the latest Bulletin of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, Washington, Canada ranks next to British India as to tobacco produced in the British Empire. "Stimulated by the preference granted Empire-grown tobaccos in the British market since September 1, 1919," says the report, "the production of tobacco in Canada has increased from 14,232,000 pounds in 1918 to 28,884,000 in 1926, Ontario furnishing about 75 per cent. of the product and Quebec most of the remainder."




