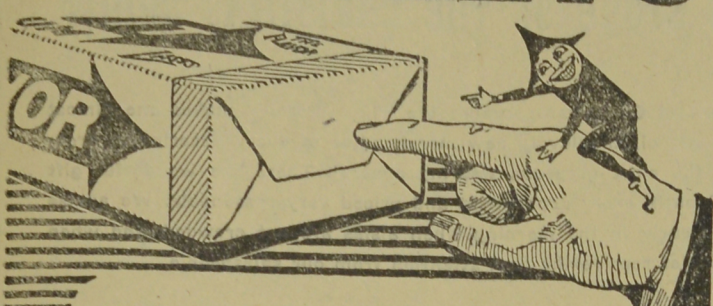

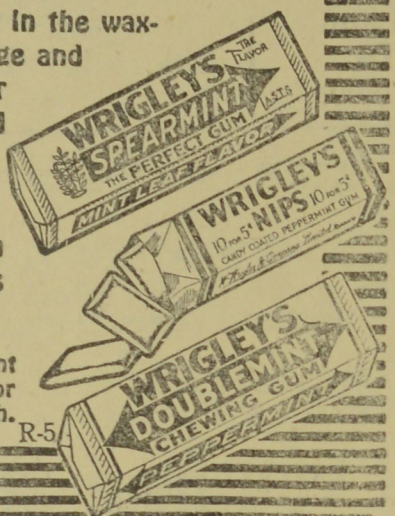

## WOMEN'S COLUMN

UNEVEN HEMLINE FOR ALL FROCKS.

Can you wonder whether the uneven hemline is smart when fashion pursues so many tactics to achieve it? Sudden length at one side, circular fullness sweeping down in back, a fantail effect, cascade tiers, intricate cutting, curving bands in back which end in streaming pieces—all contribute to the mode of unexpected uneven hemlines.

### MARLBOROUGH PIE.

6 medium sized apples.  
3 eggs.  
1 cupful of sugar.  
1 tablespoonful butter.  
Juice and rind of one lemon.  
1 cupful of cream.  
2 tablespoonfuls of cooking sherry.  
Steam the apples until tender, then press them through a sieve and add to them while hot the butter. Let stand until cool. When cold, add the yolks of the eggs well beaten, the juice and rind of the lemon, the sugar, cream, and sherry. Line two deep pie dishes with plain paste fill them with this mixture and bake in a quick oven for 30 minutes. Beat the whites of the eggs into a stiff froth adding to them gradually two tablespoonfuls of powdered sugar then heap over the top of the pies and return them to the oven until a light brown.

### MOCK MINCE PIE.

1 cupful of raisins chopped fine.  
1 egg.  
1 tablespoonful of vinegar.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cupful of washed currants.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cupful cut citron.  
2-3 cupful of molasses.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cupful cider.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cupful of sugar.  
2 Boston crackers.  
Juice and rind of one lemon.  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  teaspoonful of salt.  
Roll the crackers and mix them with the fruit; add the salt, beaten egg, molasses, cider, vinegar, sugar, lemon and spice to taste. Mix all well together and make the same as mince pie.

### SOUR CREAM FRUIT COOKIES.

1 cupful sugar.  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  cupful butter.  
2 egg yolks.  
 $\frac{3}{4}$  cupful of sour cream.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoonful cloves.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoonful of salt.  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  cupful molasses.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cupful raisins.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoonful cinnamon.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoonful allspice.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cupful currants.  
Sufficient flour.  
Cream the sugar and butter, add the yolks and the sour cream to which has been added a half teaspoonful of soda, dissolved in a little warm water. Add the molasses and begin stirring in the flour, beating it in gradually a little at a time. Add the raisins and currants, cinnamon, allspice and cloves. Then add sufficient flour to make a batter which will drop from a spoon. All the whites of the eggs beaten to a stiff froth. Mix well. Drop on greased tins and bake in a moderately hot oven.

### CHOCOLATE NUT FROSTING.

1 cupful sugar.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cupful water.  
A square of melted chocolate.  
2 egg yolks.  
Chopped nuts.  
Boil the sugar with the water until it forms a thread when dropped from a spoon. Pour in a fine stream, beating continually, into the beaten yolks of the eggs. Then pour this mixture onto the melted chocolate; add one-half cupful chopped nuts, one-half teaspoonful vanilla and beat until cold enough to spread.

### FUDGE FROSTING.

2 cupfuls sugar.  
1 cupful of cream.  
1 square Bakers chocolate.  
Cook all ingredients until a soft ball is formed when dropped into cold water, then set aside to cool. Stir when lukewarm and use.
