- 4 pounds brown sugar
- 1 quart vinegar
- 1 teaspoon allspice 1 teaspoon cassia buds
- 6 whole cloves
- Stick cinnamon

1 peck green tomatoes sliced 1 cup salt

Sprinkle tomatoes with salt and let stand overnight. Drain and add She six sweet red peppers cut in strips and six sweet red peppers cut in Mr. and Mrs. James W. Fairvale strips and six medium onions sliced toes and onions in weak vinegar, skimming out pieces as they get cooked and placing in stone crocks or glass jars. SWEET PICKLED PEARS

- 16 pears
- 1 pound brown sugar 16 whole cloves
- 1 cup vinegar
- 2 large sticks cinnamon

Peel the pears, remove blossom end, but not stem. Boil the sugar, vinegar and cinnamon, broken in pieces, five minutes. Pierce every pear with a clove. Put them in the syrup and simmer until soft. The slower and longer the cooking, the better the color and flavor. Place in sterilized jars and seal. If can-




