HON. MR. STEWART in reply to Mr. Dysart:
Q 1—What amount was expended during the past year in the several parishes and counties of the Province for so-called flood damages and to what accounts was same charged?
A—Roads, \$77,055.61 charged to ordinary road expenditure. Bridges, \$11,043.66, charged to ordinary bridge expenditure. Total \$88,099.27.
Q 2—Give names of supervisors under whose direction the work in question was performed and name roads where flood damage was repaired.
A—See attached statements. Names of the roads when expenditures were made not available as payrolls and accounts in connection with work are in charge of Public Accounts Committee.
