MARRIAGE BOOM GIVES RAILROAD MORE BUSINESS

London, Feb. 22—Because of a marriage boom in Bengal and the northwest provinces of India last spring lucky stockholders in the railroad company serving that area are reaping an unusually high ordinary dividend of 18 per cent.

A favorable marriage season during last April and May was described at the annual meeting of the Bengal & Northwestern Railroad Company here as having been mainly responsible for an increase of 1,743,007 passengers compared with the corresponding period of 1926.

Marriage festivals play an important part in the railroad traffic in India, which benefits considerably if the season is propitious, Sir Henry P. Burt, chairman of the company explained to puzzled stockholders.

Toledo, Ohio, Feb. 21—The four sons of Mr. and Mrs. Stanley Kolinski celebrated their birthday today. Yet they are not quadruplets.

Edward the eldest was 16; Albin became 17; Clarence 15 and Stanley junior 13.

Each was born on February 20 and the Kolinski's have no other children it is easy to remember a birthday date in the family. But the amazing coincidence has its drawbacks. The number of candles needed for the inevitable cakes increases by four every year and the cost of 64 candles such as will grace the table tonight is not to be flickered at.

Then there is the problem of the cakes themselves. It was a simple matter back in 1909 when Edward appeared. Even in 1912 when Edward was three and Albin one there wasn't much to it.

Mrs. Kolinski had only two cakes to bake.

Things began to happen in earnest when on the next February Clarence was born.

The cake eating question was assuming proportions. It was becoming so large in fact that on every February 20 the Kolinski home resembled a baker's establishment.

And then came the climax.

To years after Clarence's birth came Stanley junior thus presenting the four cake problem which together with Mrs. Kolinski's other duties somewhat complicated matters.

But tonight four white triple layer cakes bedecked with pink candles will be on the dinner table and here after Mrs. Kolinski will bake four cakes—one for each of the boys—because some day they will drift apart and her baking will probably not be required.

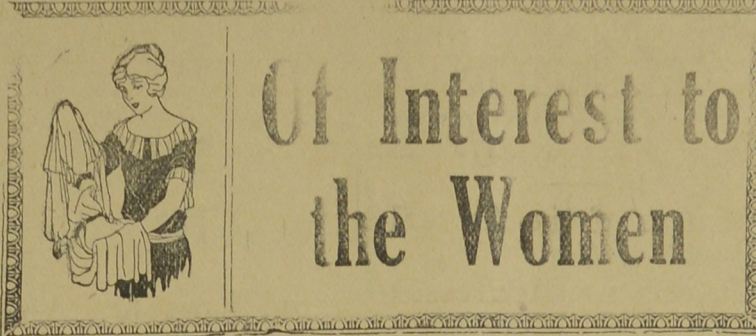

COFFEE BUTTER CAKE.

The yolks of two eggs, one half cup of molasses and one half cup of very strong black coffee to which add one half pound of butter beaten to a cream with one cup of light brown sugar. Next add one half tea spoon each of cinnamon, cloves and salt. Beat the mixture until light and creamy. Stir in 2 1-2 cups of flour and one teaspoon of soda dissolved in one half cup sour milk. Just before pouring into layer cake tins add the stiffly beaten whites of the two eggs.

Filling: Two beaten eggs mixed with one cup of granulated sugar, three teaspoons of flour, one fourth teaspoon of salt, one half cup of strong coffee, two squares of melted chocolate and one cup of sweet milk. Cook this mixture in a double boiler for 10 minutes. Remove from stove, beat in one half cup of butter creamed with one fourth cup confectioner's sugar. When cool flavor with vanilla and stir in one cup chopped seeded raisins.

LEMON CUSTARD.

One lemon, 1 1-2 cups sugar, two tablespoons flour 3 eggs, 1 tablespoon butter 1 1-4 cups sweet milk. Beat whites of eggs separately. Grate the lemon rind and squeeze the juice of the lemon add the sugar, beat, add flour and beat again, add the beaten egg yolks, melted butter and sweet milk, beating this well with a spoon. Then fold in the stiffly beaten egg whites. Line a large pie pan with a crust. Pour this mixture in, bake in not too hot an oven as the top will burn. The beating of this custard makes it twice the bulk than if it is not beaten.

DOUGHNUTS.

1 cup sugar
3 tablespoons shortening
2 eggs
1 cup milk
5 cups flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1-2 teaspoon nutmeg

Cream shortening with half the sugar. Beat the eggs with the other half. Combine the two mixtures. Add milk and sifted dry ingredients. Roll out on a floured board. Cut into rounds with a doughnut cutter and fry in deep fat heated to 350 deg. F. Turn each doughnut as soon as it rises to the top of the fat. Fry until golden brown on both sides. Drain on absorbent paper and sprinkle with powdered sugar when cool.

Be sure when you are frying doughnuts to have the fat hot enough. You cannot tell by waiting for it to smoke because all fats do not smoke at the correct temperature for frying. To test the temperature (if you don't have a frying thermometer) drop one of the centres that you have cut out of the doughnuts into the hot fat and if it cooks to a golden brown while you count 60 you will be sure that your fat is hot enough to fry your doughnuts.

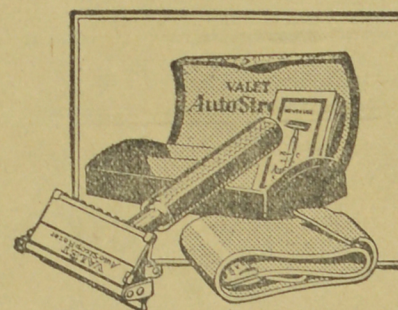
